

REFLECTION

"Lord, will only a few people be saved?"

Dear Friends in Christ, the above is a question from today's Gospel passage. Let me call your attention to the fact that Jesus does not respond to the question. Instead, Our Lord tells us how to enter the Kingdom of God or how to become a disciple. Notice that He doesn't give a number of those who will be saved. He doesn't say only two billion people or one million people or five thousand people will be saved. Rather, He says: "There is only one way. 'Strive to enter through the narrow gate'". He immediately adds: "for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

Today's Gospel passage gives us an opportunity to think about the things that are important for eternal life. What can we do to successfully enter through the narrow gate or door? What does it mean - spiritually - to be small enough to enter through the narrow gate? Clearly, Jesus is not talking about our size or weight. So, the question we might ask is: how can we make ourselves small - spiritually speaking - to be able to enter through the narrow gate? The Scriptures teach us how.

Firstly, we are taught to recognize Jesus as "the way, the truth, and the light". Our Lord is very clear: "No one comes to the Father except through me"

Secondly, we must take up our cross daily and follow Him. In other words, shallow discipleship will not cut it. We cannot serve God and the Devil. Which is why Jesus recommended the following to the rich man who wanted to know how he could earn eternal life: "Go, sell everything you have. Give the money to the poor and come follow me." Thirdly, being small is about being humble. It is about accepting the burdens of our cross, forgiving those who persecute us, and loving our neighbors as ourselves. In other words, we cannot be disciples if we do not give up our ambition to lord it over others. We must become the servant of all. Clearly, if we limit ourselves to praying a lot and

Clearly, if we limit ourselves to praying a lot and doing nothing else, we will not be able to enter through the narrow gate. If we limit ourselves to contributing regularly to everything at church and attending Mass regularly, we will not downsize enough to pass through the narrow gate.

Jesus reminds us that we must keep trying to get in shape, spiritually speaking; "Strive to enter through the narrow gate," He tells us. Jesus Christ reassures us that there is always hope if we keep striving. It is when we stop striving and stop seeking God that the way forward begins to block for us.

Let me end with a citation from Abbot Philip who says of today's gospel passage that it encourages us to remain "faithful to God, even when we can see and know our own failures". Today, "God Himself is telling us: Do not give up hope! Trust in the Lord forever".
