5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

REFLECTION

Theme: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" In one of the parishes where I worked in my native Cameroon, the chairperson of the Parish Pastoral Council of that parish was a lady. As the chairperson, she did an excellent job. When the Christian action group - Catholic Women Association to which she was a member (this happens to be the largest group in the Catholic Church in the English -speaking part of Cameroon) was preparing for their diocesan election, she was one of the three candidates that won the nomination. She shared with us - priests working in the parish, her fears and how unworthy she felt she was to handle such a position in these words: "I am not well learned to lead a group made up of mostly intellectuals, I will decline the nomination". We succeeded to persuade her to not to decline the nomination. She won the election to become the diocesan president of this group. Although unworthy, by her judgment, God used her and the association during her tenure grew from strength to strength and did a lot for the church.

"Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" A lot of people do not always say yes when they feel called to a particular task. We think about it, and we ask ourselves all kinds of questions. We do the same even when it is God calling us - whether to serve or follow Him, before we say yes or no. We give a lot of reasons and excuses to justify our not saying ves to Him. Which should not be the case. This happened with the prophet Isaiah as we hear in today's first reading: "Woe is me; I am doomed!" he says, "For I am a man of unclean lips". Isaiah didn't see himself worthy to be employed in the service of God. But God's abiding grace and His forgiveness set him free and even emboldened him before God and he cheerfully engaged in the service of God: "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" "Here I am," I said, "send me!" Dear friends in Christ, God is still addressing that question to each one of us today: "Whom shall I send?" Whom shall I send to that public office, to that sister or brother who has been away from Church for so long; to that sister or brother in prison, or at the hospital; etc.? Let us commit today, dear friends, to make Isaiah's answer our own: "Here I am, Lord, send me." Fr Boh

Hope Scholarship Program West Virginia

Catholic Schools Gear up for Application/Re-enrollment Period

Hope Scholarship Program Creates Opportunity for New Families

Catholic schools throughout the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston are preparing for the 2022-23 school year with their common application and re-enrollment period beginning in February. Schools are also preparing to welcome new students taking advantage of the HOPE Scholarship—with its application period set to open by March 2022.

The Hope Scholarship, formerly House Bill 2013, was passed last Spring by the WV Legislature. Hope Scholarship is set up to provide funds for families enrolling in private school, alternative instruction programs, or home schools. This education savings account is managed through the West Virginia Treasure Riley Moore's office and not by the Diocese.

According to the Treasurer's website, hopescholarshipwv.com, students are eligible for the program if they are:

- · A resident of West Virginia
- Entering kindergarten for the first time in the Fall of 2022

• Current K-11 student enrolled full time (or at least 45 days during the time of application) in a public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia in 2021-2022

The site also states that under the current school aid formula, each eligible student would receive \$4,600 annually that can be used toward private school, alternative instruction programs, or home school. The funds awarded can only be spent on education expenses such as tuition and fees, extracurriculars, tutoring, materials, supplies, textbooks, transportation, etc. Please visit the site to learn more about the program and receive updates from the Treasurer's office.

The application and re-enrollment period for the 24 Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston begins in February:

 \cdot February 4, 2022 (1st Friday of Catholic Schools Week) – Re-enrollment for current families begins.

· February 11, 2022- Application period opens for parishioners new to the school begins.

· February 18, 2022-General public application period begins.
