REFLECTION

Life is God's first gift to all humanity. And God has a plan for every life He created. The prophet Jeremiah in our first reading this Sunday says: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born, I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." Effectively, the prophet Jeremiah is telling us that a person still in the womb is, in fact, an entity with a right to life. And that life has a purpose that began before you ever came to this earth. God sets us apart for the unique life he has called us to live - be it as a married person, as a priest, a religious or a single person. He plans us according to his purposes for us and his plans to glorify himself by our lives. By this we know that each one of us is unique. That is why He appointed Jeremiah and not you or me as a prophet to the nations. However, as baptized Christians, we are called to witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ by our words and deeds all for the glory of God. The life of Jeremiah was a very difficult one. As a prophet, you are God's mouthpiece, and you see things through the eyes of God. This is evident from the way a prophet always begins when addressing the people to whom he has been sent: "Thus says Yahweh". Appointed as prophet to the nations, Jeremiah was forced to denounce oppression, confront those who stole and treated the poor with violence. The people fought back, but God assures Jeremiah that the people will not prevail over him, "... for I am with you to deliver you". Even with God's assurance, Jeremiah wants to shy away from the purpose of his life: "Ah, Lord Yahweh," he says, "you see, I do not know how to speak. I am only a child!"

Dear friends in Christ, we are the same as the prophet Jeremiah. We are afraid to speak out, and to denounce injustice especially against the right to life. Pope Paul VI in his Encyclical Letter "Humane Vitae" give us reason to condemn any acts that interfere with the right to life between conception and natural death: "God is the Author of Life, and the Lives He Creates are Sacred. ... To interfere with life between conception and natural death is in essence usurping God's ultimate authority. ... defies God's will for His creation and is strongly condemned by the Church."

Our challenge today and every day of our life, is to love and respect every life. To seek out God's purposes for us, be about his business for us and to trust that He is always with us to fight for us as He did for Jeremiah.

Catholic Schools Gear up for Application/Re-enrollment Period

Hope Scholarship Program Creates Opportunity for New Families

Catholic schools throughout the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston are preparing for the 2022-23 school year with their common application and re-enrollment period beginning in February. Schools are also preparing to welcome new students taking advantage of the HOPE Scholarship—with its application period set to open by March 2022.

The Hope Scholarship, formerly House Bill 2013, was passed last Spring by the WV Legislature. Hope Scholarship is set up to provide funds for families enrolling in private school, alternative instruction programs, or home schools. This education savings account is managed through the West Virginia Treasure Riley Moore's office and not by the Diocese.

According to the Treasurer's website, hopescholarshipwv.com, students are eligible for the program if they are:

- · A resident of West Virginia
- \cdot Entering kindergarten for the first time in the Fall of 2022

• Current K-11 student enrolled full time (or at least 45 days during the time of application) in a public elementary or secondary school in West Virginia in 2021-2022.

The site also states that under the current school aid formula, each eligible student would receive \$4,600 annually that can be used toward private school, alternative instruction programs, or home school. The funds awarded can only be spent on education expenses such as tuition and fees, extracurriculars, tutoring, materials, supplies, textbooks, transportation, etc. Please visit the site to learn more about the program and receive updates from the Treasurer's office.

The application and re-enrollment period for the 24 Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston begins in February:

• February 4, 2022 (1st Friday of Catholic Schools Week) – Re-enrollment for current families begins.

- · February 11, 2022- Application period opens for parishioners new to the school begins.
- · February 18, 2022-General public application period begins.
