SOLEMNITY OF MARY JANUARY 1, 2023

REFLECTION

Beloved sisters and brothers, welcome! Happy New Year. As we ring in the new year 2023, I pray that God may make this new year one of success and of good health for you and your loved ones. I also pray for a deepening of the faith of all Christians of Saint Bernadette and for a revival in our commitment to doing God's will. Today is the Octave Day of Christmas. The Church celebrates this day as the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God.

At the start of the new year many people make resolutions. Sometimes we keep them, other times we don't follow it up. But that should never discourage us. We all must have "a new beginning for a new year." The readings the Church offers for our meditation on New Year Eve as well as on New Year Day are perfect for any Christian looking to make meaningful resolutions for 2023. For my reflection, I have used excerpts from these readings to put together a list of 10 New Year's resolutions. If you are looking for effective ways of changing your life for the better, then you'll be sure to find some useful information here that you may want to consider. Here they are:

- Attend the gym of faith: I resolve to enroll and attend the gym of faith, strengthening the muscle of my belief through daily prayers, attendance of Mass, reading of the Bible and devotions to Mary and Saints of God.
- 2. Lose weight: I commit to lose the chains of slavery to and excessive weight of sin by praying for God's grace to accept me as a son, daughter and heir endowed with the spirit of adoption that cries out Abba, Father.
- 3. Keep healthy: More than my physical body, I will devote myself in 2023 to upholding my spiritual health by embracing Jesus who makes me a child of God "born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision, but of God".
- 4. Save money: I commit to save for a spiritual reward in Heaven by shunning every lie, notably from the antichrist, as alien to the truth of the gospel revealed to me by "anointing that comes from the Holy One".
- 5. Daily walk from darkness to light: I shall strive to walk daily from the darkness of sin into the light of Jesus, Word of God made flesh, and "light of the human race".
- 6. Build my dream home: I pledge to love my neighbor as myself with the love Christ wants me to extend to His brothers and sisters: the homeless, the poor, the hungry, etc. in the prayerful hope of being rewarded by God building a place of rest for me in everlasting life.
- 7. Capacity building: I resolve to identify my vocation and to develop my capacity to fulfill your calling for me in this life including by serving my fellow parishioners of Saint Bernadette.
- 8. Sign up to apostleship: I pledge to emulate the example of the shepherds of Bethlehem, who went out in haste to make known the message of the gospel, glorifying and praising God with my life aware that it may be the only Bible some people will ever read.
- 9. Review my spending: I commit to spend less time bothered by the distractions sold by false prophets and the antichrist, praying that God may keep me from temptation, forgive me when I slip and help me to forgive those who

wrong me.

10. Blessings of peace: I commit to offer the prayer of Aaron and his sons on all – my loved ones but also my enemies – that God may bless all; let His face shine upon all; be gracious to all; and look upon all kindly and give them His justice and peace throughout the New Year 2023.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY JANUARY 1, 2023

Sacrament of Baptism: Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
