REFLECTION

Our Gospel passage for this Third Sunday of Easter, is built around Peter and his confession of Love at the bank of the sea a few days after the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When Christ was arrested Peter denied him three times and he even disappeared. Three times Peter rejected knowing Jesus, and today he professes three times that he loves Jesus. This declaration of love is an opportunity Christ gives to Peter to 'erase' the denial. What he did out of fear and weakness, he now takes away out of love and God's merciful love which knows no boundary. You and I can experience this transformative power of God's love. in many ways and different places, we too, might have rejected Christ in what we say, think, or do or fail to do. And this constitutes sin which is essentially a denial of love. Certainly, we all need to work on our love, and that is why this passage should be so significant to us. We should hear Jesus asking us this question three times also. We should realize that He is not satisfied with a simple, "Lord, I love You." He wants to hear it again, and again. He asks us this because He knows we need to express this love in the deepest way. Let our response not be a faithless copy-work of Peter's answer but an ascent of faith; "Lord, You know everything, You know that I love You!" This must be our ultimate answer.
