REFLECTION

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. It is not a holiday in the United States. So, whereas other dioceses celebrated on Thursday, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston is joining other dioceses within its Church Province to celebrate Ascension on this Seventh Sunday of Easter. On this day, we commemorate the ascent of Jesus Christ into Heaven, which occurred on the 40th day after His Resurrection. Along with Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost, the Feast of the Ascension ranks in the universality of its observance among Christians.

I would like to focus my reflection on the following words of Saint Paul in our second reading: "May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom ... May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call." This is Paul's prayer for the Ephesians and for all of us. Paul asks God to grant Christians, wisdom beyond human wisdom, so that they can understand the mystery of the Church. He asks God to open our eyes and hearts so that we can fathom the greatness of the hope to which we have been called.

God's "call" is sometimes very difficult to understand or wrap one's arms around. When the boy, Samuel, was called, he repeatedly thought it was Eli calling. God has called us, too, but we are often deaf to the call or, when we hear it, we are uncertain as to what God is calling us to do. We toy with questions about it. We wonder if God is calling us to a particular ministry in our parish. We are, at times, uncertain whether He is calling us to a religious vocation, or to a married life.

At the same time, God has called us to some things... and the call is very, very clear. In the first chapter of his Epistle to the Ephesians, Paul mentions some of the obvious things to which God has called us. In Ephesians 1:4 Paul tells the Ephesians that God has called us "to be holy and blameless in his sight." In Ephesians 1:5, he says God has called us "to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ." And in Ephesians 1:12 he says we have been called by Him "for the praise of his glory."

This is God's call to all His sons and daughters. However, it is only by His grace that we can be who He has called us to be. It is for that reason that Paul offers prayer so that the eyes of our hearts should be enlightened to know the hope to which we have been called. We are not called to the hope that the people of this world hold onto in life. We have been called to the hope of a people who, although committed to their work in the world, regard themselves as foreigners in this world, awaiting the return of Christ. It is not the hope of winning the lottery. It is not the hope that causes so many to fret and worry about worldly possessions, positions, and power. When we have the hope that Christ gives, we do not indulge in rituals or work at being "better" in hope that we will find favor with God and receive His blessings. As Christians, our hope is certain and sure because it is based on God's eternal promises to you and me. So, let us heed the admonition of the two angels to the disciples in our first reading and engage in the life of witnessing to Him right to the ends of the world, in the assurance that our 'hope will not fail us.'
