REFLECTION

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, today we celebrate the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. Our readings speak of the joy and hope that God's presence brings into the lives of his people.

In our first reading, the Prophet Jeremiah evokes God's promise to return His people from exile. In the Gospel, Jesus hears the cry of Bartimaeus, the visually impaired son of Timaeus, and restores his sight and dignity. Bartimaeus teaches us not to allow Jesus to walk by us every day without calling out to Him to have pity on us and heal us of our blindness especially in matters of faith.

Our second reading opens our eyes to the daunting challenges our priests face. Priests, we all know, are neither Angels nor superheroes. Every high priest is a sinner, "beset by weakness... taken from among men" and "called by God, just as Aaron was." He is a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek, called to "offer gifts and sacrifices for sins" – both their sins and the sins of the people.

Two priests – Rev. Fathers Serguio Luiz Santos and Wally Soares – have a moving petition online calling on Christians to pray for priests after yet another priest committed suicide in Brazil. "Don't see us only as Christ in glory, because most of the time we're wounded, injured, bloodied and full of sorrows," they write, echoing the words in the Letter to the Hebrews. "Priests are glorified by God, as Christ Our High Priest was glorified by His Father: "You are my son: this day I have begotten you".

These priests appeal to Christians as Bartimaeus appealed to Christ: "For love of God, help us! Help us to carry the cross on the arduous ascent to Calvary. We aren't superheroes. Priests are men, with weaknesses and limitations... Let's pray, love and care for our priests" described as "the least among men, whom He has chosen to serve Him. Pray for us incessantly, and when we fall, help us: PRAY MORE," they write.

Let me thank you, Christians of Saint Bernadette for your prayers, your wonderful care and support to your priests, notably my predecessors and myself. May God richly bless you. The Lord is good, all the time! All the time, the Lord is good! Fr. Boh

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
