

REFLECTION

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, and it marks the beginning of Holy Week which includes the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Today's Liturgy celebrates a joyful procession to remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. With palm in hand, we echo the ageless antiphon "Hosanna to the Son of David." Holy Week includes the Triduum, that is, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. These three days are special days of prayer in preparation for the feast of Easter. The Triduum gives us the opportunity to ponder anew the Paschal Mystery – the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. By this Paschal Mystery, Jesus has restored fallen humanity to friendship with God. What we celebrate during the Triduum is what we celebrate each time we gather to celebrate the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

At the start of today's liturgy, the celebrant greets us in these or similar words: "Dear brethren, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of his Passion and Resurrection." Yes! We have prepared for the celebration of this Week by Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. These have helped us spiritually so that we might approach Easter with mind and heart renewed. This renewal is God's work of grace in us, both for life-long Catholics as well as for all who will be Baptized or make a Profession of Faith into Full Communion in the Catholic Church on Holy Saturday. Together, we shall encounter God's grace in the liturgies we celebrate.

Dear friends in Christ, this week each year Christians are drawn to Jerusalem, if not in body, at least in mind. They accompany Jesus from Pilate's court to Calvary. As we embark on this journey with Jesus Christ in mind and spirit, let us ask God for the grace not to get swayed by the allurements of this world. Happy Holy Week to you all!

Chrism Mass

What is Chrism Mass? It is one of the most solemn and important liturgies of the Christian liturgical calendar. Maundy Thursday is the usual day in which this Mass is celebrated in a diocese or archdiocese. But in some dioceses, it may be another day during Holy Week. The bishop, joined by the priests of the diocese, gather at the Cathedral to celebrate the Chrism Mass. This Mass manifests the unity of the priests with their bishop. Here the bishop blesses three oils — the oil of catechumens, the oil of the infirm/sick, and holy chrism which will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese for the year. This year this celebration shall take place on Monday and Tuesday during Holy Week at Charleston and Wheeling respectively. Fr Boh shall be attending the one at Wheeling.

Good Friday Collection: The Pontifical Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land. This annual collection not only supports the Holy Places, but above all provides for those pastoral, charitable, educational and social works which the Church supports in the Holy Land for the welfare of the Christian brethren and of the local communities. This collection "... is not something ancient or outdated, because it expresses above all our awareness of being rooted in the proclamation of redemption, which spread from Jerusalem and reached us all. The gesture of offering, even a small one, but by everyone, like the widow's mite, allows our brothers and sisters to continue to live, to hope and to offer a living witness to the Word made flesh in places and on the streets that saw his presence."

WHAT IS GOING ON?

Parish Pilgrimage: On Saturday, April 2, a small but prayerful group from St. Bernadette gathered in the parking lot of the parish. The pilgrimage started with a prayer at 9:35 AM. The pilgrims then journeyed through the Maryland mountains to the National Shrine Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes in Emmitsburg. The first stop was Mount Saint Mary's Seminary where Father Boh gave a prepared talk on Forgiveness. After the talk, the group took the opportunity to meet and talk to several of the 150 seminarians studying for the priesthood at Mount St. Mary's. The next stop was the



Shrine complex located on the mountainside above the Seminary. It was a sunny but crisp day as the group did the stations of the cross on the pathway to the Grotto. This was followed by private prayer and reflection at the Grotto, a place frequented by St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in the early 1800s. The Grotto has since been transformed into a replica of the Grotto at Lourdes, France, the place the Virgin Mary appeared to a young St. Bernadette, our patron saint. The day ended with Holy Mass at St Mary's Chapel, a contemporary glass building overlooking the valley below, celebrated by Fr. Boh.
