

REFLECTION

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. The history of Divine Mercy dates to 1931 when the world was in the midst of the Great Depression and the memories of World War I were still very much alive in the minds of Europeans when in Poland a sister of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), is said to have been personally visited by Jesus. It was only in 2000 following her canonization that Pope Saint John Paul II proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Faustina's visions, already popular in many communities.

One will be tempted to ask the question: What is the Divine Mercy Feast All About? In fact, the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina is filled with invitations from our Lord Jesus Christ to celebrate with Him the great Feast of the Divine Mercy. The answer to the above question is spelled out by Jesus Himself for Faustina. It had been Jesus' own wish, she wrote, to establish a feast day: "I [Jesus] desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls... I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of My Mercy. ... If they will not adore My mercy, they will perish for all eternity". This Feast is "a lifeline," so to speak, to souls who are perishing, souls who are drowning in sin and despair. Jesus attaches to this Feast tremendous promises of graces, benefits, and comfort. This Feast is not only for a select few, all are invited especially poor sinners and those who are most in need of His mercy. "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy".

On this Mercy Sunday Jesus is offering us a complete renewal of our baptismal grace, a complete cleansing of the soul and washing it clean, renewing within us all the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit that we received at our baptism.

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ, as we celebrate

this Feast of Divine Mercy, we are reminded of our need to be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers. "If we are not practicing the works of mercy in our lives," says Saint Faustina, "then our celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday would be a kind of blasphemy, rather than an offering pleasing to the Lord". Wealthy of note is the fact that a plenary indulgence is granted to those who celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and receive the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday. Let us commit as a parish community to do the Hour of Great Mercy (a time of prayer traditionally celebrated at 3 p.m.) in our parish church every First Friday of the month. "Jesus! I Trust in You".
