#### REFLECTION

Dear brothers and sisters,

Happy Easter Sunday! The Lord has risen from the dead! Alleluia! Easter is one of the central holidays of Christianity. It honors the Resurrection of Jesus three days after His death by crucifixion. Along with Christmas, Easter is one of the most important celebrations in the Christian calendar. It is when Christians glorify and give thanks that, Jesus by His rising, has conquered death and redeemed us from sin. Our Christian faith is built upon the resurrection, because, if Christ had not risen, the Christian faith would have no foundation. Writing to the Corinthians Saint Paul says: And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is without substance, and so is your faith. What is more, we have proved to be false witnesses to God, for testifying against God that he raised Christ to life when he did not raise him -- if it is true that the dead are not raised. For, if the dead are not raised, neither is Christ; and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is pointless and you have not, after all, been released from your sins. In addition, those who have fallen asleep in Christ are utterly lost. If our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are of all people the most pitiable." (1 Cor. 15:14-19).

Someone has said that; "When we celebrate the birth of Christ in Christmas we do not only celebrate because He was born. If He was born, crucified, died, was buried but remained dead, then we would not be celebrating His birth because He wouldn't be who He had claimed to be. He wouldn't provide the salvation and redemption He declared He came to give". Easter celebrates Jesus' triumph over death. So, what is the significance of Easter to us Christians?

The resurrection of Jesus means that eternal life is granted to all who believe in Him. Jesus told Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live" (Jn. 11:25). The resurrection of Jesus is a total confirmation of all that He taught and preached during His three-year ministry. If He had not risen from the dead or simply died and not been resurrected, He would have been thought just another teacher or prophet. However, His resurrection rebuked all that and provided final and undeniable proof that He was the Son of God and that He had overcome death once and for all. Because of the resurrection, the disheartened apostles of Christ were able to get out of their hiding for fear of the Jews and boldly preach the gospel. The resurrection became the foundation of everything they said and did.

Like the apostles of Christ, may we at Saint Bernadette find strength in His resurrection to become an "Easter People", bearing witness to His abundant love in a frightened world. May He strengthen our confidence in His unfailing grace and grant us the courage to move onward even when we cannot see the way, knowing that He will guide our every step. Amen. Happy Easter!

**Sacrament of Baptism:** Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
