

REFLECTION

Don't Fall for Cleverly Devised Myths Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We live in a time when too many false prophets want us to fall for false beliefs and "cleverly devised myths" used to fill their pockets. Here are a few examples:

You may have heard of the South Africa-based Zimbabwean-born pastor who rose to notoriety by claiming he had raised a dead man back to life. Accomplices rolled a casket into his church with an actor playing dead in the coffin. The pastor prayed and claimed a miracle when the supposedly dead man rose even as the awe-struck congregation watched, speechless or in thunderous praisesinging applause.

A once famous Nigerian (now deceased) claimed to be a prophet capable of foretelling everything, except that when he foretold who would win the next World Cup, the team lost. This Nigerian prophet failed to foretell that the high-rise hostel building in which he housed followers would collapse on them, killing dozens.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, in the second reading Saint Peter indirectly warns us against falling for such falsehoods. He reaffirms that the teachings of Christ, as handed down to us by the Apostles, are not based on any such "cleverly devised myths". Saint Peter is assertive: "we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty," he writes. The Apostles lived and worked with Christ. They were there when God made the "unique declaration" during the Transfiguration of the Lord: "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased... We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain".

These words of Saint Peter, the man whom Christ personally chose as the rock on which to build His Church, are even more important today than when they were first written, notably to Christians in the United States. Sadly, even in this deeply Christian nation, dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary... in this land whose currency bears the bold inscription "In God We Trust..." Christians are drifting further away from the faith handed down by the Apostles.

A Gallup poll released in June 2022 showed that belief in God, which was reaffirmed by 98 percent of U.S. adults in 1944, 1947, and in two other surveys conducted in the 1950s and 1960s, dropped six percentage points compared to 2017. Seventeen percent of U.S. adults do not believe in God today; up from only two percent who did not believe in the 1960s. The decline affects more than belief in God. U.S. Catholic Bishops launched the Eucharistic Revival after a Pew Research showed that only sixin-ten (63 percent) of the most observant U.S. adult Catholics believe that Christ is present in the Eucharist.

We, Catholics should not be in such doubt. The Apostles – Peter, James, and John – who accompanied Jesus to the mountain and witnessed His Transfiguration, provide the words we should all have in our mouths: "It is good that

we are here..." in the Catholic Church. Every time we reaffirm our belief as Catholics should be a day of Transfiguration for us because, as Saint Peter states: "we possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable". Our job and responsibility as Catholic Christians, is to "do well to be attentive to it".

That prophetic message is presented anew to us today in the vision narrated in our first reading by the prophet Daniel. He foretells the end times... when all of us shall come before God's judgement throne. When the books of our lives shall be opened, and we shall all render account of our lives. We cannot divert from our faith in chase of miracle-working fake prophets selling "cleverly devised myths".

Let us pray in thanksgiving to God for "it is good that we are here..." in the Catholic Church. Let us pray for our own transfiguration as we reaffirm our belief that the "Son of man" has everlasting "dominion, glory, and kingship" which will never "be taken away" from Him and that cannot be destroyed. Let us pray that more and more U.S. Catholic Christians will, "rise" and "not be afraid" notably during this year of Eucharistic Revival in proclaiming, along with the Psalmist, the Transfigured Christ as our "King, the Most High over all the earth". God bless you!
