Vacation Bible School – Another First at St. Bernadette Catholic Church

After the launch in January 2022 of monthly Eucharistic celebrations led by children; after the setting up last year of a Teen Choir; and after the start in October 2021 of the celebration of Holy Mass with the African Community, Vacation Bible School (VBS) is another first at Saint Bernadette Catholic Church, Hedgesville.

The first edition of VBS closed last Friday after five days of Bible study and loads of fun for a first cohort of graduates numbering 15 children.

Parents thronged the main hall of Saint Bernadette's Religious Education facility Friday evening to attend their children's graduation from their week of learning.

Excited voices exclaimed "Awesome God!" each time one of their teachers prompted them by pointing out that "God is surprising".

"Some people think God is boring," the teacher's voice rang out. To which the students roared in united chorus: "Awesome God"!

"Pray to Saint Matthew to help you be opened to surprises in your own life," students were told as they reviewed why Matthew, the Evangelist, must have been surprised by Jesus inviting him, a tax collector and public sinner, to become one of His Apostles.

Graduation events on Friday started earlier in the pavilion where students shared an early dinner of pizza, culminating with students each receiving a certificate of recognition and savoring a piece of their end-of-course celebratory cake.

Joined by the Administrator of Saint Bernadette, Rev. Father Aloysius Boh, parents followed attentively as Parish Secretary, Lynette Kammerer, made a presentation rounding-up what students had learned during the week. They watched as their kids, in their new role as "Young Bible" Scholars", answered questions, chanted, and playfully danced to "Monumental Love" the theme song of their week of Bible study.

CCD teacher Suzy Kinn and Cindy Lathwell (one of the parent volunteers) alongside Lynette - taught the Bible lessons supported by teenagers who served as "crew leaders" for each of the four breakout groups, with some of them doubling as babysitters for the youngest kids.VBS unfolded more as a summer Bible camp than as a school. Students had great fun every day, getting to know each other better and, whenever given the chance, demonstrating that they can be trusted to show love and care to each other. "One of my students - one of only three girls in attendance this week - was rather shy at the beginning until the older girl took her by hand and essentially played 'big sister' to the younger one and being her companion throughout the week," explained Suzy, who is a retired teacher. Children engaged in playing "Jumping Jet" under the supervision of Cindy and were taught the values of patience, forgiveness, and reconciliation. A series of lessons dubbed "From Joseph to Jesus" used details from the story of the biblical Joseph to teach the beauty of the forgiveness and extraordinary kindness which Joseph showed to his brothers who had sold him into slavery in Egypt. Teaching involved dramatizing, with each student taking turns to play Joseph. Once in this character, the student adorned a cloth symbolizing the royal mantle of authority Joseph wore as governor in Egypt in the period following the seven years of drought and severe famine. As is often the case, some of the teaching was students teaching their own teachers. "Tears filled my eyes when I saw how intently one of the children focused on Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during the adoration session we held with the kids during the week," explained Linda Abrahamian, the music director at Saint Bernadette. The child had asked and received permission from Linda to get as close to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as possible. Linda narrated that as the child knelt in prayer, her gaze fixed on the place of repose of the Blessed Sacrament, she (Linda) realized that the child had taught, anew, the big lesson of the joy and love one experiences by merely getting close to God.

Another example occurred during the Holy Mass celebrated with the VBS class, recalled Cindy, the mother of three of the students in this cohort. The kids demonstrated how much better they understood what the Eucharistic celebration is through their reverence, the keen attention they paid, kneeling and standing, when it was required of them, and being most respectful in the House of the Lord.

Teachers did a fantastic job of breaking down the Bible lessons so that they could be easily understood by children across the various age groups and different levels of education in attendance: from kindergarten through 6th grade.

"One of the kids in my class basically served as my substitute teacher, ensuring that the class was interactive, asking questions, and being quick to offer answers or suggestions as well as in motivating his classmates to speak up and get involved," explained Suzi.

VBS used songs, games, snacks, giant posters, flashcards, art, attendance at Holy Mass, adoration of the Eucharist, and a five-part series of videos to tell stories of God's awesomeness to His Creation on land, sea, forest, or desert. Videos projected to the students used the stories of animals but also the stories of ordinary human beings – Samuel, Bronson, Fabio, Riley, and Wesley and Hannah - performing extraordinary deeds of kindness, to encourage the students to pray to God to lead them to their own vocations.

"Hit your knees on the floor every morning you wake up and say three "Hail Mary's" followed by the prayer of purity to start every day," Linda told the first set of graduates from VBS, reminding them to pray for the gift of holy priests, religious, good citizens, and loving parents.

"We want our children to soak themselves in the Bible as the foundation of their faith so that they can find strength in it when they face the trying years of adolescence and the many temptations they must deal with in a world full of distractions," said Father Boh about the goal of VBS.

Happily, and most helpfully, organizing future editions of VBS should be easy. Students who graduated Friday as "Young Bible Scholars" intend to be ambassadors to others. Replicating VBS will rely on a curriculum that is available for purchase through Our Sunday Visitor.

Through their children, several of the parents who had been seeing each other but not interacting during activities at Saint Bernadette, got formally introduced to each other, spent some time together during the VBS, and will henceforth, hopefully, embark on making Saint Bernadette Catholic Church a truly loving family, full of surprises and blessed by our truly "Awesome God".
