

#### REFLECTION

Theme: "Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God."

Sisters and brothers in the Lord, welcome! Today the Church celebrates the Second Sunday of Advent, Year B. According to the tradition of the Church, today we light the second purple candle that is a symbol of faith. Where do we find comfort when life is overwhelming? How do you handle the news that you are being laid off? When your marriage begins to unravel, or your children live in rebellion, how do you fight the depression and loneliness? We've all experienced times in our lives when we have felt fearful or anxious about the future. We feel a sense of helplessness because we worry about things that are out of our control.

In the morning of Thursday, January 18th, 2018, I received a call from a friend back in Cameroon informing me that my rectory was firebombed by government security forces early that morning. When this news was later confirmed with pictures, I was overwhelmed. I shared the sad news with Fr. Pooch, and he immediately invited my elder brother and I for lunch during which his primary concern was how I was feeling, if I had heard from my bishop and what he is doing about the situation. He also wanted to know what can be done to help me deal with the present situation. This approach by Fr Pooch was very comforting and reassuring. Like I have said, we have all experienced moments of despair in our lives when we are anxious about the future.

The Israelites—God's chosen people were much like you and me. They battled despair as they lived in Babylonian captivity due to their own covenant unfaithfulness. They have been there for seventy years. There were only a small number of the Jews who survived in this far-away land, they were trying desperately to hold on to their memories of their God and his Word-a God who seemed as dead as their land and their hopes. They knew they deserved to be where they were, but now they wondered if God would ever hear their prayers again. And then, in that hopeless situation, God once again spoke a word to his people. God sent a message through the prophet Isaiah that gave Israel new life and new hope: "Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God." Tell them to get ready. They're going home. "Speak tenderly to Jerusalem and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the Lord double for all her sins." These are comforting words of the Lord to a people in despair and they are meant to arouse a sense of confidence in his people and urge them to put their trust in God. Isaiah worked hard to dissuade the people of Israel from trusting in man, in the power and might of the princes of this

earth and rather turn to God with all their heart.

In the midst of all our hopelessness, St Peter, in the second reading, gives us a message of hope: "Since everything is to be dissolved in this way, ... and elements melted by fire. ... But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which right-eousness dwells." This is the reason Saint Peter is not worried by what will precede the emergence of this new order, as horrible as it may seem.

Like the Israelites, we have turned away from God and today's Gospel message challenges us to a change of heart, just as John the Baptist said to the hosts of people who streamed to the wilderness to listen to his message. He told them that someone would be coming after him who would be greater than he was. So, "Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight his paths." In the same way, if all of us open our hearts to welcome Christ by turning away from all our sins and wrong doings, if we become God fearing and God loving community, then we will have a wonderful celebration of the birth of Immanuel – God with us. This should bring comfort.
