

REFLECTION

Sisters and brothers in Christ, the Lord is good. All the time. And all the time. The Lord is good.

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent Year C. It is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." This Sunday is so named because the underlying theme of today's readings is Joy! The first reading starts, "Sing for joy, daughter of Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel!" The Psalm begins, "Cry out with joy and gladness". In the second reading Saint Paul calls on the Philippians to "Rejoice in the Lord always, I shall say it again: rejoice!" In the gospel passage, John the Baptist advises his listeners on what to do to make everyone happy; whoever has should share with the person who hasn't.

I dare say that John the Baptist's counsel should attract our attention as we prepare for the coming of the Lord within this advent period that is swiftly drawing to a close. Following John's counsel, the most urgent area we need to give greater attention to is our inter-human relationships. And this is in total agreement with what we celebrate at Christmas: the incarnation, God's unreserved turning of attention to man. With his incarnation God wanted to show us that the most urgent place to find him is in the human community.

Dear friends in Christ, we can see that what we are to do to prepare the way for the Lord is not farfetched. It all consists of a turning to our neighbors to make life worth living for them, so that they may also smile at Christmas. Thank you, beloved sisters, and brothers of Saint Bernadette, for always trying to live up to this counsel. Thank for always doing all you can to put a smile on the face of those in need. We thank the members of the various committees for their wonderful coordination. May our smile continue to be contagious as we approach the celebration of Christmas. God bless you. Happy Sunday.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.
