#### REFLECTION

THEME: 'Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful'.

In the next couple of weeks, it will be spring. We remember the beauty this season brings. It comes with all the joys of rebirth and birth; it awakens and enlivens us in a way no other season can. It is a time farmers go out to plant. A time we think about growth. Spring provides a beautiful environment for creativity and meditation. Seeing the plants head towards the sun with each passing day and its roots reaching deep in the ground for nutrition and stability, the only question that readily comes to mind is 'What are we growing towards?' The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is celebrated as "The Word of God Sunday". God's Word is the seed that has been sown in our hearts and it needs to grow. For it to grow and produce the required fruits, you must make the necessary investment. If you never water the plants in your garden or shade them from sunlight, they will wither, not grow. And so, it is with our relationship with God. Continuous growth in our relationship with God is important because knowing Him changes us. Growing in Christ enriches our life and helps to develop a Christ-like nature that coincides with that of our Heavenly Father. It is only when you continue to tape the nutrients necessary for your growth in your relationship with God and with one another, just as the plant draws its own nutrients from the sun and the earth for growth, that you can be able to do what Christ asks of you in today's Gospel passage - love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. Dear friends in Christ, may we stretch out our roots to the waters of life, and draw the nutrients we need to grow in our relationship with God and with one another, by deepening our prayer life, our daily reading and meditation of the Word of God, and a worthy reception of the Sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. May this spiritual nourishment give us the energy we need to replicate the life of Jesus in our homes, our parish community, and our places of work.

#### FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Mass Intentions: We want to thank those who have been offering Masses in our parish and to encourage everyone to try and offer Masses. You can ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. In one of his Encyclical letters, St. Cyril of Jerusalem explains how at Mass, both the liv-

ing and dead are remembered, and how the Eucharistic Sacrifice of our Lord is of benefit to sinners, living and dead. Therefore, the Sacrifice of the Mass brings certain benefits upon the Church to the living faithful as well as the poor souls in Purgatory. The stipend given to the priest for offering a Mass in the diocese of Wheeling-Charleston is \$10, which thereby in justice creates an obligation which must be satisfied. To have a Mass offered on the occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, is appropriate, beneficial and appreciated.

On-going project on 107: Plans for the demolition of the property at 107 W. Main St., adjacent to the church, are currently progressing. Issues, such as asbestos and hazardous material, have been addressed and resolved. This week, our demolition team met with a number of contractors interested in bidding on the project. We are now waiting for bids to be submitted. Once the bids are reviewed they will be sent to the diocese, with our recommendations, for approval. We are grateful to Pat Winkelman and Jim Sabol for accepting to champion this project.
