The Pastoral Concerns Committee of the Diocesan Pastoral Council would like to thank you for you for your participation with our Pastoral Concerns Survey this past Fall. We appreciate your input and sharing your thoughts and concerns with us.

We would like to provide you an update on the status of analyzing the data on the Pastoral Concerns Survey. We had a robust response with approximately 2000 responses; 1400 of those were electronically submitted and the other 600 paper survey were mailed in and manually input into the system. We are in the process of having the information analyzed by the University of Notre Dame. We have some preliminary results and hope to have a full analysis by May; we look forward to sharing this information with you soon and using your valuable insight moving forward.
