#### Mission Statement:

#### REFLECTION

The main theme of today's Scripture readings is Divine vocation – that everyone is called by God to be a witness for Christ by doing something for others with his or her life, using his or her unique gifts and blessings. Hence, today's readings remind us of our personal and corporate call to become witnesses for Jesus, the Lamb of God, by leading lives of holiness and purity.

Our first reading recounts the call of Samuel, one of Israel's greatest prophets, the one who would ultimately anoint Israel's greatest king, David. The Lord calls Samuel by his name while he was sleeping. Many of us do not normally want to be disturbed from our sleep and thus, sometimes, pay deaf ear to summons reaching us while we are sleeping. But Samuel had to rise four times from his sleep to respond to a voice calling him that he didn't know precisely where it was coming from. Three times he heard the summons, not knowing where the voice came from, he ran to Eli because he thought he was the person calling him.

Would you have returned to Eli the third time after the first and the second rebuffs? Would you not have rather wondered to yourself: what is wrong with this old man, he can't sleep, and he doesn't want anyone else to sleep? Does he think I am also an old man who has lost all sleep from his eyes? But that was not Samuel's reaction. He was a man ready to be bent double. He would have returned again and again to Eli if he believed it was Eli calling him. And when Eli eventually realized that it was the Lord that was calling Samuel and gave him what response to give upon the next call, Samuel promptly made the suggested response his own. When the Lord called again, Samuel responded: 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening."

How many of us can still behave like Samuel today? How many of us have the disposition to do the listening, leaving the talking to the Lord? Are we not rather more given to the tendency to do the speaking, expecting the Lord to do the listening? We like to talk rather than do the listening. We prefer to give orders rather than to be ordered around.

God calls Samuel by his name – a rare but not unheardof privilege in salvation history. God "... does not deal with anonymous masses," says Fernando Armellini, "for him we are all important." Nothing is more personal than a name. God knows us by name.

Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ, God has a unique call and purpose for our lives, and we must embrace that vocation. So, ask yourself 'what does God want from for me?' Why did He bring me into this country, into my family, into Saint Bernadette Parish, Hedgesville. If you don't know, then you have not heard his voice. Could it be that God has not yet spoken to me yet or that I have not listened? Maybe you haven't realized God is calling you. God called Samuel four times and with Eli's help Samuel realized it was God calling him. It might be difficult to hear God's voice calling you amid the noises that

surround you, however, He continues calling until we answer. God cannot be heard in noise and restlessness, only in silence. He will speak to us if we give Him a chance. If we will listen, if we will be quiet. "Be still," the Psalmist wrote, "and know that I am God" (Ps.64:10). Even when we are quiet, we still need the help of others; our spiritual directors, our parents, people closer to God, members of our parish community, etc. to able to understand that it is God inviting or calling you for a particular mission.

Exercises: I recommend the following exercises for the week to be done as a family. (1) How did the little boy find himself in the Temple? (2) How can parents help their children grow to love and serve God? (3) How does God speak to us?

Word of God Sunday: On September 30, 2019, a Motu propio Apostolic Letter "Aperuit illis" issued by Pope Francis established the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as the "Sunday of the Word of God." This year, January 20/21, 2024, has been designated as "Sunday of the Word of God" and is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the Word of God. Recalling the importance given by the Second Vatican Council to rediscovering Sacred Scripture for the life of the Church, Pope Francis explains the celebration has "ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity." Some of the activities to mark the celebration of this shall include: The enthronement of the Bible in the Parish Church during the 9 AM Mass and blessing of the readings during all three Masses.
