

REFLECTION

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our readings this weekend are linked by the theme "listen". In the first reading Moses foretells the coming of a prophet who will speak in the Lord's name and the people must listen to him. The Responsorial Psalm urges us not to harden our hearts if we hear God's voice. Saint Paul in the second reading urges everyone, especially those who are celibate for the sake of the Kingdom of God to give undivided attention to the Lord. And in the Gospel the people in the synagogue listen to Jesus as He taught them with authority.

Like I said, this weekend's readings are about listening. Listening to that 'still small voice within.' Those in charge with formation in various houses of religious formation are aware of just how easily both the formator and the one in formation can miss God's voice as He speaks through the whispers of his Spirit. This has made the role of silence in formation houses key to the formation process. Back in my Major Seminary days, we had very strict rules on silence. Maximum silence was always required in and around the seminary chapel and everywhere else in the compound from 9:00 pm, that is, after night prayer until 7:45 am after breakfast every day. The purpose for this is to create an atmosphere that is conducive for seminarians to be able to silence to that 'still small voice within'.

"If today you hear His voice, harden not your heart." These words from the Responsorial Psalm capture the theme of listening adequately. This is meant to be understood that God is always knocking on the doors of our hearts no matter where you are, or who you are. He knocks seeking to enter, and if you hear Him then let Him in, the Psalmist urges us. The prophet Isaiah listened when God spoke to him: "The Lord GOD opened my ear; I did not refuse, did not turn away." (Is. 50:5). If we harden our hearts to God's voice, this will not only be wrong but foolish. Remember what our psalm for last Sunday said: "Teach me your ways, O Lord." So, if we harden our hearts when He speaks to us, then we will end up making choices that lead to hardship and pain. God's ways are always the best, and when we listen to Him, He gives us his guidance for how to live our lives. "Make known to me your ways, LORD; teach me your paths." (Ps. 25:4)

Beloved in the Lord, let us pay attention to the God who can speak to us anywhere – in the Church, while you are plowing your driveway, in the shopping mall, or while you are making deliveries. During the coming week, let's spend a little more time being attentive, listening for that still small voice within, and do not harden your heart if he is calling you to the

priesthood, and/or religious life. Ask Him for the grace and the courage to say YES as Mary did.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Some events of interest within the week – Friday February 2nd, 2024, Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. Also known as Candlemas. This feast commemorates three distinct but related historical events in the life of the Holy Family. First, it marks the day when Mary and Joseph brought baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem, exactly 40 days after his birth. Second, the purification of Mary after the birth of her child. She didn't need this because she was perfectly pure. Third, today's feast also commemorates the encounter in the temple between the Holy Family and Saint Simeon the prophet and Saint Anna the prophetess. This is the third and final infancy epiphany of Jesus. Traditionally, families also bring their own candles to church to be blessed on this feast. The candles represent the fact that the light of the world is here; the light is coming into a dark world as the Church calendar progresses towards the brightness of

Ideas for celebrating this feast day:

Go to mass and bring a stack of candles to be blessed for use over the next year! We will have mass and blessing of the candles at 9 AM on Friday.

Spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament and meditate on the constant fiat of Our Lady of Sorrows, who embraced the will of God even as Simeon predicted that a sword would pierce her heart.

If you haven't taken down your Christmas decorations yet, today's the day!

Saturday February 3rd: Optional memorial of Saints Blaise, Bishop & Martyr, Saint Ansgar. Bishop, and it is also the First Saturday of the month: We will have Mass at 9 AM followed by Rosary. Saint Blaise is associated with the healing of throats. During Mass on that day, we shall bless the throats of those present.
