REFLECTION

A few months ago, I received a very disturbing phone call from Cameroon from the elder brother of a young man named Gerald. He had helped me in the parish where I last served before traveling to United States. Gerald had been attacked by bandits who inflicted several wounds on his head and made away with the motorcycle taxi he was riding. This phone call was followed up by pictures of Gerald in the hospital. The pictures put me to tears. As I was trying to digest this, I received a text from Gerald's elder brother informing me that the hospital had refused Gerald any treatment because they have not paid in the deposit of about \$600.00. I didn't have the money, and so, I decided to share my worry with a parishioner who immediately accepted to help. He showed up in the office the next day with \$600.00. A day or two later, the same parishioner came to the office and gave me some additional money: "I hope this will help pay for the rest of his medical bills," he said. He went on to say that the other day when he left the parish office, the story of the Good Samaritan flashed through his mind and when he got home, he thought that he should do something more to help not only with his medical bills but with some extra money for his feeding. This is the kind of love that today's readings speak about - love of God and all human beings regardless of race, creed, or color.

This kind of love is exemplified by the Good Samaritan. The story of the Good Samaritan invites us to make ourselves neighbors to others, especially those in need: 'Go, and do the same yourself.' The parishioner above did not know Gerald, he had never seen him, but he acted as a neighbor to him. This is what the Commandments of God ask of us - love God and neighbor. When we are really moved by love, we shall certainly be neighbors to many, and cross many boundaries to be closer to those in need. It is this love that moved the Samaritan to stop and to help the man in need. The same love made him pay the bills and promised to take care of whatever might be necessary. It is this love that moved the parishioner to assist Gerald begin his treatment. It was the same love that made him show up again and gave more financial assistance to Gerald. The action of the Good Samaritan is not just being charitable but a manifestation of unconditional love for neigh-

Dear friends in Christ, every day, in so many ways, we meet people who desperately need our help. How we respond is our choice. We can choose to respond to the need by crossing to the other side just like the priest and Levite in today's Gospel passage. We can close our eyes and hearts to them. Or we can offer them the much -needed help like the parishioner. Or again, like the Samaritan, we can go out of our way to help in whatever way we can. The help we give might seem very little,

but as Flor McCarthy puts it: "... These are the little drops of 'oil and wine' which can take some of the pain out of a wound." Jesus sends us out today to do like the Samaritan. Aided by His grace, may we reach out to those who need help and do what we can to care for them in whatever way we can.
