Parable of the Hidden Treasure

#### REFLECTION

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Every day we are faced with decisions that we must make; whether to take a new job, pursue a career, marry, become a priest or religious, buy a home, or commit to this ministry or that ministry in our parish community.

Our Liturgy of the Word for this weekend has decision making, or choices, as a kind of a central theme. In the first reading, Solomon is invited to make any request of God. Solomon, we are told, asked for wisdom to rule well. God was pleased with Solomon's request and in verse 13 (not included in today's reading) we are told that God granted him a heart shrewd and wise as none before has had and none will have after him. In the second reading, Saint Paul tells us that if we chose to love God, we can turn everything to our spiritual advantage. And in the Gospel, the man who discovers the treasure hidden in a field or a pearl of huge value goes and sells everything and buys it. Imagine a neighbor selling his/her pots, plates, cups, and just everything to buy a piece of land that seems like any other piece of land. You will conclude there must be something wrong with this neighbor. He or she is mad. Jesus says that whoever finds the Kingdom of God has discovered a great treasure. Once convinced, the person may seem to have gone mad. He gives up everything to have it. I have seen people in my native Cameroon sell the 'life wire' of the family (coco farms and other family assets) to foot the bills of a child who won the Diversity Visa Lottery to make sure the child doesn't miss that opportunity to travel to the United States of America. They consider this a worthwhile investment because, for them, the presence of this child in the USA will drastically change the life of the entire family for the better.

This neighbor who is actively selling his/her plates, pots, etc. to buy a piece of land; this neighbor who is selling his/her coco farms and other family assets does so with joy, the kind of joy with which the two people in Jesus' parables get rid of everything they had. Why such a joy in giving up or selling everything that you possess? What will make a person get rid of everything? There is only one motivation they understand the value of the treasure. This can be likened to a student who changes his/her lifestyle, gives up parties and unhealthy relationships and settles down to study to become a judge to defend the rights of innocent children that are abused.

The two people in today's parables understand that Jesus and His Kingdom is so precious that it is worth everything. This is to teach us that if we fully appreciate the surpassing worth of Jesus and his kingdom, we will joyfully give everything up. We will love the Lord our God with all our heart and with all our soul and with all our mind and with all our strength, as the Book of Deuteronomy 6:5, and Mark's Gospel 12:30 tell us. We will joyfully give up our lives to Jesus and follow Him. We will joyfully say no to sin. We will joyfully lay down our lives for Jesus as Saint Paul puts it beautifully in his Epistle to the Philippians: "But whatever gains I had, these I have come to consider a loss because of Christ. More than that, I even consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss

of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, ..." (Phil. 3:7-9a)

This should be the joy of every Christian who has truly found Christ, but for those who have not found Him, they think Christians are mad.

The lesson to take from these two parables, is the realization that to enter the Kingdom of God demands a lot more from us followers of Christ than just attending Mass and saying our prayers; one must be ready to give up everything, even life itself. Let's pray dear friends for the grace to say NO to anything that stands or wants to stand between us and God.
