

#### REFLECTION

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In remote villages and lands across the world, where agriculture is not mechanized, farmers work in groups and in solidarity in order make what is very tedious labor light, and even enjoyable. Many of us who grew up in farms know what I am talking about.

In my village, each farmer who had been blessed with a plentiful harvest of corn, beans, peanuts, coffee, or cocoa invited their friends and neighbors to help them to bring in the harvest into the barns. When I was growing up, my siblings and I would invite dozens of friends to help us to harvest and bring home, by head load, the corn our parents had out in the fields. Our friends would invite us to their parents' farms, and we would, thus, return the favor. We did the same when it came to chopping down thick forest or wild bushes in preparation for farming. Girls and women, who generally ploughed the fields, did the same – inviting their friends to help till one farm at a time and then returning the favor until all farms were ready.

In our gospel passage this weekend, Jesus Christ, with a sense of urgency, invites us all to join Him in a similar exercise of making the plentiful harvest of God's vineyard light. "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few," Christ says, calling each of us to service: "so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest". There's a certain degree of restlessness in Jesus based on a burning concern for the people before him. Seeing this need in the crowd, He picked from the ranks of his many disciples, twelve leaders and called them apostles to whom He entrust this delicate task. Looking at the authorization he gave the twelve, "... Cure the sick, raise the dead, ..., drive out demons" we may feel that it is not given to everyone to enlist in the army with which Jesus wanted to march out to arrest the pathetic situation he saw before Him. Is Christ's invitation directed exclusively to those who have the gift of working miracles?

I am sure Christ wanted and wished as many as possible would enlist in his army to liberate the people from kinds of hunger. Our job, as Christians, does not necessarily involve working miracles. How do we know this? Good question! I am glad you are asking yourself that question. We know because God our Father is a caring God and He sent Christ on a mission of compassion into our world: to preach the Good News of the Kingdom, to die for sinners; to set captives free; to bring hope to the hopeless; to cure the sick. It is to this ministry of compassion that we have been called by Christ of whom today's gospel passage records: "Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them (the crowds to which He preached) because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd". Christ is no longer walking around physically in this world. We, Christians, his disciples are his hands, voice, and feet in our world today. His invitation remains an urgent appeal to us because the situation has not changed even in our own time. There are still many burdens on our fellow men which we can help to remove, burdens imposed on them by ignorance and poverty.

As with the twelve disciples in our gospel passage, Christ has sent us to our brothers and sisters to be the miracle within our community and within our own parish, through the amazing works we are doing in our various ministries. That is why I can never thank you enough for the service you render in God's Vineyard here at Saint Bernadette. Thank you for serving in our Social Concerns ministry. Thank you everyone who serves as an usher, lector, altar server, in our bereavement and hospitality ministries, in our liturgy committee, in our parish council, in the choir, in the religious aid education program, in setting up for Mass, in decorating and keeping our church clean, in cleaning vestments, as eucharistic ministers, etc. These ministries help all of us to extend Christ's ministry of compassion and love to our brothers and sisters. It is this ministry of compassion and love that UNBOUND is responding to and that brings Fr Martin Holler to St Bernadette this weekend.

I would also like to thank those of you who are still thinking and praying for discernment before choosing a ministry in which to serve. The truth is that God has blessed us at Saint Bernadette with such an abundant harvest that our duty is to do what the Psalmist demands of us: "serve the Lord with gladness".


