REFLECTION

I was born and raised in a village in the traditional kingdom of Kom, in the Northwest Region of Cameroon, called Njinikom. Growing up in this village, there was no electricity. Once night fell the entire village was in pitch darkness. I was afraid to go outside at night for whatever reason. But unfortunately for me, I had to use the restroom at night, as all humans do, and this meant going out in the dark because our home, like every other home in the village, was not equipped with internal bathrooms and/or toilets. But because I was afraid of darkness I would not even get out of my bed at night when I felt the urge to ease myself. I ended up wetting my bed practically every night. My dad tried to talk me out of this practice with no success. So, he adopted a strategy to help me overcome this fear. How? He made me run at least an errand for him at night almost every week. On such nights he will typically begin by telling a weird story after the family dinner about devils and ghosts moving up and down a particular road. And this always turned out to be the road I will have to take as I go on the errand. Once he finishes telling the story, he will say something like; "Oh no! I forgot to ask you to go drop off this parcel at my friend's home. However, it is not too late for you to go now. Pick up the parcel and leave immediately. I will be expecting you back in the next couple of minutes," he will conclude. A glowing splint was all that I had as a light to light up our path. No torch lamps. This was my dad's strategy to eradicate the fear of darkness in me as well as in my siblings. I will always tell us: "You are not alive because you are intelligent. You are alive because God wants to be alive". In the Gospel passage last Sunday, Jesus picked His twelve apostles and sent them out to proclaim the Good News. Today knowing that His apostles are fearful as they go out on this mission because of the hardship and persecution they will have to face, Jesus exhorts them three times to be fearless; "Do not be afraid". He warns them not to be afraid of those who may kill their body in persecution here on earth. They should worry about God's judgment which can cast body and soul into Gehenna.

It is normal and natural that courage will sometimes fail us, and we will be afraid. Those who have accomplished great things have known moments of fear in their lives, for example, Jeremiah in the first reading, and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Fear is not necessarily a bad thing. But it can paralyze a person. It can turn a person into a coward. I was paralyzed by darkness. But thanks to my dad, I overcame this feeling of the fear of darkness.

Jesus assures His apostles of God's special care in all their trials. It is amazing that I was still fearful of darkness, in the company of my dad, I could go to any place and at any hour of the night in the village without the slightest fear. The prophet Jeremiah lived out his vocation during a time of turmoil. He lived with constant threats to his life; "Yes, I hear the whisperings of many; 'Terror on every side! ... my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine." Jeremiah overcame his fear and remained faithful to his mission because he was convinced that God was on his side: "The Lord is at my side, a mighty hero". God was at the side of the apostles, and they remain faithful to their mission even to the point of shedding their blood.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Lord is on our side too. And while at times we will grow fearful, we must not allow our fears to cripple us. We need ordinary courage and not heroism to live a Christian life. We need courage to always tell the truth and to raise our voices against injustice, despite the risk and the danger to our life. Let's beg God to give us the courage we need to bear faithful witness to Him in a world that has its own values that are sometimes contrary to the Gospel.

Permit me to end this reflection with this one verse from a song by an anonymous composer:
God will take care of you be not afraid,
He is your safe-guard thro' sunshine and shade
Tenderly watching and keeping His own
He will not leave you to wander alone.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
