#### REFLECTION

Our Gospel today recalls the Transfiguration of Our Lord at the top of a mountain. Luke tells us that, "Jesus took Peter, James and John and went up the mountain to pray". This was not unusual. We know from the gospels that Jesus often went off by himself to the mountains to pray and He will spend hours in prayer. In the Bible mountains are associated with the presence of God. It was at Mount Sinai that Moses encountered the glory of God and there he received the gift of the Ten Commandments. (Exodus 24:12f). In the first Book of Kings, we are told that the prophet Elijah contested with the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kgs 18:20-40). In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus delivers the Beatitudes in his Sermon on the Mount location unknown. The Transfiguration of Jesus which we read in our Gospel passage today takes place on Mount Tabor. While they were praying something wonderful happened. Jesus was transfigured; that is, he was changed; his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. The Transfiguration of Jesus is the moment when the disciples encounter God through Jesus and Jesus, in turn, is seen as the fulfillment of the law (Moses) and the prophet (Elijah). A voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him." The voice confirms the suspicion and crave of the disciples. Jesus is the Messiah. Peter had earlier, moved by the Holy Spirit, correctly identified him as the Messiah, the Son of God. But now it is the Father himself who says it. The disciples were overcome by what they witnessed. Once composed, Peter utters the famous words, 'Master, it is good that we are here.' Closeness to Jesus brought joy to the disciples. This is the joy that we will experience when we come close to Jesus. Lent is the favorable time to better our relationship with God and one another and so draw ever closer to Jesus. As we face the daily challenges of life, may we live with God's glory in view until we enter that eternal relationship with Jesus in Heaven.
