

REFLECTION

Welcome to Saint Bernadette. Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent. On behalf of the Christians of Saint Bernadette, I wish welcome in a special way all those who are worshiping with us for the first. Thank you for choosing to worship with us today.

"Lord, it is good that we are here". These are the words of Peter to Jesus in today's gospel passage when he had a glimpse of the glory and the truth about Jesus. We should make these words of Peter ours, too. "Lord, it is good that we are here" at Saint Bernadette. Our Scripture readings demand that we do something more than merely express the wish to enjoy glorified moments in the presence of the Lord. Peter did not just express the wish to be there. He offered to "make three tents": one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. We, too, at Saint Bernadette must continue to build a tent (parish) worthy of the Lord. A parish where people feel welcomed, loved, and appreciated. When Peter proposed to build three tents, he was sig-

When Peter proposed to build three tents, he was signaling that he did not want to go back. He thought he could just wish Heaven and it would become a reality, but Jesus assures him, and all of us, that we must take up our cross daily and follow Him. "The son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised". (Luke 9:22). This message of Jesus can be translated in everyday lingo. "No omelets without breaking eggs". "No sweat, no sweet". "If you want to eat succulent cookies, you must be prepared to burn your fingers in the oven".

What does this mean for us? It means that for us to enjoy eternal glory, we must listen to the beloved Son, with whom the Father is well pleased. We must be ready to deprive ourselves of what gives us joy for the sake of the Kingdom. This is seen in our readiness to leave our comfort zones - our homes, selfishness, pride, greed, sinfulness, etc. Obviously, we must do what Jesus tells us to do, emulating the example of Abram who "went as the Lord directed him". Abram was considered the richest man in the world at the time. He had made it in life. Apart from being advanced in age - at 75, he had everything he needed, humanly speaking. Although long happily settled in "the land of (his) kinsfolk", when he heard the call of the Lord, he abandoned a life that had given him security, and set out on a new unknown course.

Peter, James, and John followed the instructions of Jesus to go down from the mountain experience into the harsh difficulties of witnessing to the gospel in the plains below. The question to all of us is: are we doing as the Lord has directed us or are we too afraid to pay the cost of preaching and defending the gospel? Saint Paul exhorts us: "Bear your share of hardship for the gospel". If you are afraid, Jesus is telling you: "Rise,

and do not be afraid."

In our own weakness, let us pray, as Saint Paul says, for the grace and "strength that comes from God" to do "our works" according to "His own design". With the Psalmist, let us entrust our fears and worries to the Lord who has "destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel". May God help us so that, working together, we may build Saint Bernadette into a beautiful place for God. A place so pleasing to those who visit and worship with us that they may, like Saint Peter, exclaim: "it is so good to be here".

May Saint Bernadette Soubirous, pray for us.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
