#### REFLECTION

Theme: "Lent is a Time for Change"

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Lent, Year C. On Ash Wednesday we began the Lenten season - a forty-day journey characterized by prayer, fasting and almsgiving that will end at sundown on Holy Thursday. Lent is a period of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent we seek God in prayer by reading, and meditating on the Bible, we serve Him by giving alms; and we practice selfcontrol through fasting. In his message for Lent 2022 Pope Francis says that "Christians must persevere in generously doing good in the world, bolstered by prayer and by fighting evil in their own lives...." He goes on to say that: "Lent is a favorable time to seek out-and not to avoid-those in need; to reach out—and not to ignore—those who need a sympathetic ear and a good word; to visit—and not to abandon—those who are lonely". Lent allows us to grow closer to God, the church, and to one another.

Today's Gospel reading focuses on the temptation of Jesus. In preparation to start his ministry, Jesus departed to the wilderness where he stayed for forty days. He sought for aloofness from the world to make a solid preparation for the reason why he came, the salvation of the world. His departure from the people presented Him face to face with the devil, the very enemy of humankind that Jesus had come to salvage. There and then Satan approached the new man as he did the old (Gen. 3:1 -13). Mark, who likes being succinct and direct, did not record the dialogue between Satan and Jesus. He only presented the contest as that between good and evil. And in this contest, good overcame evil; Jesus defeated Satan and began to proclaim the Kingdom of God. Hence, he declared: "The time has come; the Kingdom of God is at hand. Change your ways and believe the Good News". In solidarity with Jesus begin your journey to the desert; arm yourself with fasting, prayer and works of mercy. Get involved in the affairs of the Church. You will conquer!

In response to the call addressed to all of us by this Lenten season to make sacrifices, kindly consider in making a sacrifice of your valuable time on one of the Sundays programmed for discussions on 'SYNODALITY' to stay back after the 9 am Mass at the McFadden Hall and give your own input or contribution to this endeavor. 'Please, make your voice heard'! Let us pray dear sisters and brothers, that we will be more opened to receiving the grace of God during this Lenten Season and make use of it by purifying our hearts, detaching ourselves from worldly pleasures, focusing more on improving our relationship with God and our brothers and sisters and be more charitable with what God has blessed us with.
