REFLECTION

In his book "New Sunday and Holy Day Liturgies", Flor McCarthy, SDB, tells a story which I found interesting and thought I should share with you. The story is about a twelve-year-old called Stephen who was lame from polio. He had a brother Mark, who was ten. Though they fought a lot, as boys will, deep down they were good to each other. At times Stephen envied his brother who had two good legs.

One night he dreamt that he was in a deep and mysterious forest. There he came to a dark cave. At the center of the cave a bright fire burned. Then out of the shadows came a man wearing a long robe. He told Stephen that he was the warlock of the forest, and that as a reward for finding the cave he could have one wish fulfilled - just one wish, anything he desired.

Stephen doesn't need much time to make up his mind. 'I wish that I may have two good legs,' he said. With that the warlock threw his cloak around him and before he knew it Stephen was back in his own bed. His brother was sleeping soundly in the next bed. The warlock lifted the blankets off Mark's legs.

- 'What are you doing?' asked Stephen.
- 'I'm beginning the operation.' said the warlock.
- 'What operation?'

'The transference. When the operation is over you will have Mark's legs and he will have yours. But don't worry. No one will ever know. They will think that it was always like that.'

'I never thought it was going to be like this,' said Stephen.

'You hardly expected me to pluck a pair of good legs out of the air, did you?'

But Stephen was in a state of deep shock. A picture flashed through his mind. He saw himself running freely along, and behind him, dragging his leg came his brother Mark. He couldn't do that to his little brother. 'I don't want it,' he cried out.

On hearing this, the old warlock was very angry and went away. Stephen was glad to see the back of him. Next morning, he woke and looked across at his brother. Remembering his dream, he smiled. From that day on he never again felt envious of his little brother, and he loved him more than ever.

Stephen wanted to be happy but not at the expense of causing misery to his brother. True happiness is found only in unselfish love. To love is to put the other person first.


