

## REFLECTION

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ,

All of us pray to God, asking our Father in heaven to grant us certain favors and wishes. The Apostles and disciples had favors and dreams they hoped Jesus Christ would bring to realization. One example is the request by the mother of the sons of Zebedee, "Command that these two sons of mine sit, one at your right and the other at your left, in your kingdom" (Mt. 20:20-21).

During the three years of Christ's earthly ministry, the Apostles and disciples nursed their dreams. When Christ was unjustly condemned, crucified, and died on the cross, his followers were devastated and terrified. Even though they had heard Christ preach, they still thought he had come to extricate Israel from domination under the Roman Empire. They hoped that Christ would restore Israel in its earthly glory. So, when the Risen Lord appeared to them over those 40 days before His ascension (which was last Thursday in some Latin (Arch)dioceses where the feast was not transferred and this weekend in the United States because of the decision of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to transfer the Feast to this weekend), the Apostles and disciples wanted to remind Jesus of the mission they believed he had for them. They were not going to let this second opportunity slip before asking: "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" Jesus disillusions them. The establishment of this Kingdom will be neither quick nor easy. He does not tell them when but how. Their request is a reminder that our prayers to God and our expectations of what God should do in our lives (most often than not) border on the earthly, rather than on the spiritual. We forget that Christ died on the cross to make us heirs, with Him, not of some earthly Kingdom (Israel), but of God's heavenly kingdom.

Sadly, we are like the Apostles and disciples. We spend way too much time gazing into the heavens and pleading with Christ to do our will, not the will of the Father. We demand an earthly kingdom for ourselves, instead of relishing in the kingdom of God which Christ has won for us. Instead of praying and truly meaning that we wish for God's kingdom to come and for God's will to be done on earth as in Heaven, we are asking God to do our will and bring about the kingdom of our earthly dreams. We are asking God to give us that big house, that latest model car. We are asking for that better-paying job; for that pay hike we have done nothing to deserve; and we are asking for a cure for our illnesses, etc. Scripture teaches us not to make it about our selfish desires. We have been created, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, to Know, Love, Serve God, and to be happy with Him forever in Heaven. We are, therefore, to lead lives that bring about, not our earthly kingdoms, but the heavenly kingdom. Appropriately, Saint Paul prays in our second reading, that the eyes of our hearts may be enlightened.

Jesus gives His apostles a very important task: "... you will be my witnesses". He honors them (and now honors

us) by entrusting them with the task of carrying on his mission not only in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and I dare add Hedgesville, but "...to the ends of the earth". It is this witness of the Apostles that will bring about the new Israel, the Kingdom of God, which is manifest visibly in the world as the Church. Fernando Armellini says, "The truth of Jesus' message will not be proved by prodigies, wonders or other extraordinary events, but by us when we live like people newly risen" (Celebrating the Word, Year A, Commentary on the Readings). Writing to the Ephesians and to all of us, Saint Paul reiterates that we have been given "a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge" of Christ. We are endowed, Saint Paul notes, with "the surpassing greatness of his power". We are coheirs with Him who is "head of all things", who is seated at God's right hand in the heavens. We are the brothers and sisters of Him, to whom "all power in heaven and on earth has been given"; beneath whose feet all things have been placed, "far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion". Like Him, our job in this world is not to restore some earthly Israel into its former glory, but to go out and change the world by our life of witness aware that He is with us "... always, until the end of the age". Dear brothers and sisters, the most effective way to witness to Jesus is by living a Christian life.
