REFLECTION

"Pentecost Came Early to St. Bernadette".

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am, hopefully, not exaggerating by saying Pentecost Sunday (which we celebrate today) came eight days early for 14 of our young adults here at Saint Bernadette when they received the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday, May 20, 2023. "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit," Bishop Mark told each confirmand as he traced the sign of the cross on their foreheads with the oil of Chrism.

In lieu of our regular reflection, I just want to say 'Thank You' to Debra Mackesy (Religious Education Coordinator), Theresa Highlands (RCIA teacher), and to Frank O'Neill (Grade 7 & Confirmation class teacher). Bishop Mark Confirms 14 Christians at Saint Bernadette (By Herbert Boh)

Scores of Saint Bernadette parishioners were on hand on Saturday, 20 May 2023, to witness the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation by Bishop Mark. This Sacrament is necessary for the completion of Baptismal grace. "By the Sacrament of Confirmation, (the baptized) are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit" (CCC #1293).

In his homily, Bishop Mark called on the 14 confirmands and the people of God present to do five things: to pray in private; to participate in public prayer, notably Holy Mass; to go confession; to read the Scriptures; and to lead lives of service to others. Even though it means a lot of the other messages are left out, I'd like to limit myself to what I recollect the bishop saying in those five messages.

First Message: Pray daily. Make talking to God an obligation. Thank Him at the rise of each day and before going to bed each night. Offer the day to Him, on your way to school or work, and thank Him when the day is done. Whatever works for you, do it in private prayer, Bishop Mark said, borrowing advice of an old monk who once said: "Pray as you can, not as you can't".

Second Message: As often as you can, attend Holy Mass, which is a public prayer. Take the command to honor the Lord's Day – Sunday – seriously. Do not stay away or make excuses for not attending Holy Mass. Come to Mass so that God can continue to strengthen you.

Third Message: Confess your sins frequently, especially before Easter, at Christmas, and at the beginning and end of summer break. Benefit from the Sacrament of Forgiveness and the Infinite Mercy of God, as Pope Francis calls it. Be reconciled with God who renews our lives. Bishop Mark lauded confirmands who, in letters to him prior to confirmation, said confession is now a routine in their lives. He encouraged all to do the same.

Fourth Message: Read the Scriptures. Not the whole Bible (73 books for the Catholic Bible) in one go. Borrowing from Saint Jerome, who translated the entire Bible from its original languages – Hebrew, Albanian, and Greek – into Latin, Bishop Mark said "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ" quoting St Jerome. Read the Word of God and you will come to know your Savior better. Begin by reading short passages at a time. Start with the gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Fifth Message: Serve others, the bishop urged the newly confirmed. Begin with your own family, your neighborhood, school, church, and community. Take joy in giving, as Jesus says, for there is more joy in giving than in receiving. Giving kills our self-centeredness and shields us from the popular belief that we should accumulate more things, money, wealth, and property for ourselves. That is contrary to Christ's teaching. Make the fruit of your faith works of love and justice, giving yourselves to others as this is how you'll find joy and fulfillment.

For want of space, this account leaves out the many thrilling stories the bishop told to spice his homily. Some were of his own childhood, growing up in racially segregated America. Others were anecdotes shared by Christians the bishop ministered to over his priesthood, which is now in its 47th year. In the 1980s, the then Rev. Fr. Mark came regularly from Rockville, Maryland, to say Mass at Saint Bernadette, at the time a small, mission station. The message Bishop Mark gave sponsors – asking them to continue providing spiritual support and guidance to the newly-confirmed – is one that parishioners of the young St. Bernadette Parish have for the bishop: continue in your role as chief shepherd of God's flock in Hedgesville.
