

REFLECTION

Today's gospel passage is taken from the first of three farewell addresses of Jesus at the Last Supper, just after Judas left the room. This address is like Jesus's last will and testament before his passion and death. It contains promises that are profoundly comforting in the face of the death of a loved one. Jesus had told his disciples that he will be with them only a little while longer, and that where he is going, they cannot come. No wonder the disciples are troubled. Their beloved teacher is leaving them. But Jesus responds to the anxiety of his disciples by saying, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me" (14:1). He assures them that he is not abandoning them. Rather, he is going to prepare a place for them, and after he has prepared them a place, he shall return to take them with him. Jesus assures his disciples that the place he is going to is also their destination, and not only theirs, but of anyone who believes in him. Therefore, the Father is our destination. For those who believe and hold to this destiny there are palpable practical implications that this belief must have for this present life. That practical implication is performing the same works as Christ. "I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father."

How can we perform the same works as Christ? How can we perform more works than Christ? Can we raise more dead people than Christ? Can we feed more hungry people than Christ? Can we reach more people with our preaching than him? Yes, we can. Our world is different from the world of Christ. We have more and better tools. We can reach more needy people faster than it was possible in the time of Christ. Most importantly, we only need to believe in Jesus, and we shall see that there is much more we can do for the neighbor than Jesus did. We have more resources today than Christ. He had to borrow the bread and fish to feed the five thousand.

I want to use this opportunity to thank you, Saint Bernadette parishioners, for all that you are doing in Christ for our needy brothers and sisters as individuals and/or as members of Social Concerns Ministry, Bereavement Ministry, etc. Just think for a second what our communities, our world would be like if we were not performing these works in

the name of Christ. Thanks to you and the so many believers around the world, living-dead people who have lost hope in life, now have hope and a reason to live on, because a person reached out to them. Some of our actions have saved lives of both the living-dead and the unborn. Dear brothers and sisters, truly those who believe in Christ can do more than him if only they were to truly believe in Him.

Sacrament of Baptism: Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
