"But the 'call' is much more subtle than that, and responding to it requires a good measure of human encouragement. Vocations are seldom the result of visions, dramatic miracles or near-death experiences. Instead, nurtured by others, they grow quietly and gradually, like seedlings which receive the necessary sunlight and water to mature into beautiful trees....

"It cannot be understated that our homes are the primary places for the renewal of vocations. I don't think it's a coincidence that the decline in religious vocations in the United Stated mirrors the decline in the traditional family structure. Pope John Paul II wrote that 'the future of humanity passes by way of the family.' So if we wish to transform our culture-and create a culture conducive to priestly vocations—we must first transform our families."

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
