REFLECTION

Theme: "Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come."

Advent is here. Today, the First Sunday of Advent, marks not just the beginning of our preparation for Christmas, but also the beginning of a new Liturgical year of the Catholic Church, Year A. The word 'Advent' comes from the Latin word 'Adventus', which means 'coming.' Advent is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. It is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, focus particularly on our preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord.

Advent devotions, including the Advent Wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. Lighting the candles on an Advent wreath helps us to remember that Jesus, the Light of the world, is coming. We start with one candle, and every week light one more, so that the closer we get to Jesus' coming the brighter it gets. The prophet Isaiah and the evangelist Matthew are our main guides through this period. They call us to a life of preparedness.

The Gospel reading for this Sunday from St. Matthew reminds us to stay awake and constantly be ready for chances to bring about the kingdom. The kingdom of God is present and hidden waiting to be revealed into the light through our actions and words. What are the things we can be doing to reveal the light? We should love one another, care for the sick, feed the hungry and help the poor. By doing these things we will be heeding the advice of Jesus who tells us never to let ourselves forget that this world and this life are only temporary and that we have something much greater to look forward to: Jesus and Heaven!

As we prepare for the Christ's coming, let us open to him who wants to share our human condition in loving care. During this time of Advent, I invite each of you to open your heart to this great love, as together we wait in peace and trust for Christ the Light to come! I wish you the very best this Advent Season!





Celebration

Sacrament of Baptism: Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
