

REFLECTION

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ, the first reading and the gospel of this day speak about two widows. In the ancient patriarchal world of the Old Testament, widowhood presented a difficult time in the life of a woman; even as it is in some parts of the world today. It is against this background that the Prophet Elijah visits with the widow of Zarephath and saves her from famine and sure death. The widow willingly prepares a meal for the man of God, and she is rewarded for her generosity. On one level, this story makes no sense. Taken literally, it seems impossible. Many people will think this is exaggerated, but there are many in our world today whose daily experience is no different from that of the Widow of Zarephath. Make no mistake, we still live in these times of dire need. According to the United Nations, about a billion people go to bed hungry every night in this world of ours. Many people in Africa die of hunger and starvation than die of malaria. This is something that is important and should concern all of us.

In our gospel passage today, Jesus praises the widow who dropped two copper coins into the treasury box. What she offered was a poor offering by human standards, but rich in the sight of God.

The lesson we can all learn from our gospel passage is that God is not impressed and pleased with our pomp and show, our power and wealth, but with a heart that is overflowing with love, generosity, and sincerity in our religious practices. It is not how much we give that matters, but how we give. It is in God's nature to be generous in sacrificial giving, and we, God's children need to follow His example.

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ, we can all give from our plenty. But the widows in our first reading and the gospel teach us that the value of any gift that we make lies in the kind of heart that gives it. And that when it is the heart that gives, no matter what the gift is, how great or how small, the gift is blessed in God's eyes. May our faith move our hearts so that we give not only from our plenty/surplus but from our necessities and give until it becomes a sacrifice pleasing to God. I leave you with this quote: "Love is like a basket of loaves and fishes: you never have enough until you start to give it away." (Anonymous)

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, welcome to Saint Bernadette on this 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. A special welcome to those visiting us for the first time. For those who intend to register as members of this great Saint Bernadette family, forms are available at the back of the church. POPE FRANCIS EXTENDS INDULGENCE By means of the decree, the Apostolic Penitentiary "confirms and extends for the entire month of November 2021 all the spiritual benefits already granted on 22 October 2020." That is, it allows the faithful to gain plenary indulgences for the souls in purgatory by visiting a cemetery on any eight days in November - which need not be consecutive - and praying for those who have died; normally, the indulgence is limited to the first eight days of the month.

A second plenary indulgence is also established for the day of the commemoration of the faithful departed, All Souls' Day, November 2. The current decree allows the faithful to obtain that indulgence for the benefit of the deceased on any day of November, at their choice.

RETREAT FOR SURVIVORS OF ALL FORMS OF ABUSE

Survivors of all forms of abuse across the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, WV are invited to attend a special retreat entitled, "The Way." The Way is 3-day guided meditation and prayer program for men and women crafted around the Stations of the Cross. It is an opportunity for healing and prayer and for survivors to reflect on God's plan for their lives through prayer and sacraments. There will be opportunities for individual counseling and spiritual direction. Sponsored by the Archdiocese of Washington, the retreat is free of charge and will be held November 19-20, 2021, for men and February 18-20, 2022, for women. The location of the retreat is not being publicized to protect the privacy of survivors.

Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.
