

REFLECTION

Our readings for this 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, Church Year C, invite us to a new appreciation of the deal God has made with us, His lost sheep, to seek us out and save us thanks to His enduring patience, His unfathomable mercy, and His never-ending love for all of us. In the first reading, the author of the Book of Wisdom says that God, who created the world out of love, overlooks people's sins so that they can be repent. Saint Paul in the second reading urges the Thessalonians to be worthy of their call and assures them that the Second Coming of Christ has not yet taken place. The gospel tells the story of the conversion of the rich tax collector, Zacchaeus.

The story of the conversion of Zacchaeus is a Bible classic, told in vivid detail by Saint Luke. He describes the scene of Jesus going through Jericho. There is commotion and electricity in the air as Jesus, almost like a rock star, goes through the town. St. Luke tells us that Jesus only intended to pass through Jericho. We believe that Jesus, who is God and man, was aware of how every detail of his journey would unfold. Luke narrates the story of Zacchaeus racing down the street, finding and climbing into a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus. Zacchaeus's best hope was that he would satisfy his curiosity when he sees Jesus as He goes by. Even in his wildest dreams, Zacchaeus probably never dreamt of what happens next. Jesus stops. Calls him out by name and invites him down from the tree. He tells the chief tax collector: 'Zacchaeus, come down quickly for today I must stay at your house'. Thus, it is not Zacchaeus who sees Jesus, it is the other way round, it is Jesus who sees Zacchaeus. Jesus is surrounded by the "upright" who immediately started grumbling. Why was Jesus going to the home of Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, which is like saying that he is one of the chief thieves, instead of to the home of those who, like the Pharisees, considered themselves holy? Our first reading from the Book of Wisdom and our Gospel Acclamation explains why. God sent His Only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to save us sinners, the lost sheep. The Book of Wisdom explains that God's mercy is possible because He overlooks "people's sins". God, the Book of Wisdom explains, rebukes "offenders little by little", warning and reminding all of us of sinners "that [we] may abandon [our] wickedness and believe" in God.

The scene in Jericho proves that we will neither be saved by our stature – short or tall, big, or small, – nor by our material status – rich or poor. We will not get a front row in our meeting with Jesus just because we think we are holy, and others are sinners. Jesus alone seeks out and saves us, the lost sheep. Zacchaeus must have heard of the teachings of Jesus – 'Go sell everything, give the money to the poor, and come follow me' (Mt. 19:21), etc. He quickly offers to make fourfold restitution of anything he may have extorted from anyone and to sell half of what he owns and to give the money to the poor. And Jesus blesses his offering in atonement for his shortcomings, welcoming him into conversion as a son of Abraham. Jesus is the only person who calls Zacchaeus by name. for everyone else, he is 'unclean'. But for Jesus, he is a child of Abraham.

I would like to end this reflection with these questions posed by Fernando Armellini (in Celebrating the Word, Year C): "With what kind of eyes do we see people? Do we see people with the eyes of Jesus or with the eyes of the crowd that sees only the bad side of Zacchaeus? Don't we describe people by their defects? Do we not call people drunkards, prostitutes, homosexuals, drug-addicts or violent? But they are not all evil or only evil. They have names. Yes, they have defects, but they have good qualities, too. Why do we see only the negative sides? Because our eyes are not guided by love as Jesus' eyes are".

Today's gospel passage is not only a story that happened in the streets of Jericho more than 2,000 years ago. Jesus is going through our own towns and cities today. Yes! He is passing through Hedgesville today. May you hear Him as He calls you by name.

God is good! All the time. Fr Boh

Masses shall be held for all our loved ones at 9 am and 6 pm in the parish Church. We are encouraged to visit and decorate the graves of our loved ones if that is possible. During this month of November, we are encouraged to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory daily.

Sunday, November 6th, Daylight Saving Time Ends: Please, remember to turn your clock and watches one hour forward next Sunday.

Sacrament of Baptism: Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of ill-

ness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
