#### REFLECTION

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, today, we celebrate the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. We wish to welcome everyone to our celebration, especially those visiting us for the first time.

Our readings today talk about love, and precisely, about love of God and love of neighbor. We cannot love God in a vacuum. There is no true love of God which does not express itself in the love of neighbor, as Saint John says, "If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen." (1 John 4:20). Loving God and loving your neighbor are inseparable. One cannot be without the other.

What we experience in our society and all around us today – the rivalry, the wars, violence in our streets, the divisions that keep us at loggerheads, and the hatred which pitches us against one another – point to the fact that this commandment that Jesus enjoins on us today has not taken root in our world. As Christians, if we fail to love, then we have failed in our calling.

The first reading and the gospel challenge us to balance our love so that it is lasting. Inspired by this commandment of love of God and neighbor, many of us have reached out to our needy brothers and sisters in various situations. May the example of Jesus continue to inspire us and animate our lives as Christians of Saint Bernadette to move steadily towards this double command of perfect love.

Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we receive true love from God, who is love. May we communicate this love to all our brothers and sisters.

#### FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, welcome to Saint Bernadette on this 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. A special welcome to those visiting us for the first time. For those who intend to register as members of this great Saint Bernadette family, forms are available at the back of the church.

Watch out for the following events in the month of November:

Monday, November 1st - The Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints. We will have Mass at 9 a.m. This year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but Christians are encouraged to attend Mass. Tuesday, November 2nd—Mass at 9 a.m. and at 5 p.m. Sunday, November 7th—Daylight saving time ends Thursday, November 11th—Veterans' Day/Remembrance Day Sunday, November 21st—Last Sunday in the Church's Liturgical Year B

Sunday, November 28th—First Sunday of Advent, Year C. Thursday, November 25th—Thanksgiving

The entire month of November is devoted to the deceased. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life but have not yet attained the joys of Heaven. A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence by visiting a cemetery each day between November 1st and November 8th. These indulgences are applicable only to the souls in Purgatory.

What is Synodality?

During the inaugural Mass of "Synod 2021-2023" last October 10, at Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome, Pope Francis provided answers to the above question: "what is synodality?"

Pope Francis calls the event "a synod on synodality" – a Greek phrase which means "coming together" or "traveling together." According to the Pope, "synodality is about cooperation. A Synodal Church is a Church which listens."

At the Mass, Pope Francis said: "Let us ask: In the church, are we good at listening? How good is the hearing of our heart?" He issued a call to Christians: "Let us not soundproof our hearts" so that our hearts can listen; our hearts can hear, "We should be quick to listen, slow to speak" (Jas. 1:19).

In a synodal Church, everyone – the faithful, the bishops and even the Pope – has something to learn; "all listening to each other, and all listening to the Spirit of truth". Pope Francis asked: Do we allow people to express themselves, to walk in faith, to be part of the life of the community without being hindered, rejected or judged?

The Synod calls us to stop and listen. To listen to the Spirit in adoration and prayer. To listen to our brothers and sisters speaking of their hopes and of the cries of faith. Stop and listen to the little ones. Mutual Listening: You speak, and I listen. I speak and you listen, Pope Francis concluded.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 6-7 PM and before Saturday Mass. Confession also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: RCIA (for children 15 and older and adults) or RCIC (for children 7-14 yrs of age). For more information call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830. Preparation for receiving First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation, call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Communally as scheduled.

Parish Membership: We give a heartfelt welcome to all new people moving into our Parish. You can get a registration form from the Parish Office. Those who plan to move from our Parish Community are asked to inform us.
