

REFLECTION

Today, we celebrate the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C. Our readings for this Sunday remind us of our vocation as Christians. We have been called, by our faith, to love and serve God's people. The readings show us how service is at the center of all Christian life and why being like Christ must entail that we reject riches, embrace poverty, and serve others in humility, in honesty and with loyalty to God.

The first reading warns us against cheating the poor or taking advantage of the most vulnerable among us. In the second reading, Saint Paul, writing to Timothy, urges us to pray for everyone, for the kings and for all in authority, since God wants everyone to be saved and embrace the truth that Christ came into the world to save sinners. Finally, in the Gospel we have the parable of the devious servant. Through this parable, Jesus reminds us that we must be good stewards of our lives and be prepared to give account of our lives when the time comes.

We need to reflect on what kinds of lives we are leading. Are we cheats? Are we getting rich on the backs of the poor? Do we pray for others? Are we astute stewards of our lives? Or are we selfishly focused on personal gain, cheating, and crushing anyone on our path? Christ is clear; we cannot serve God unless we turn our backs on Mammon (the Devil), the gospel tells us. We are serving Mammon if do all the things that the Prophet Amos warns us against in our first reading. We cannot be serving God, if after a worship service, we get back to making money by dishonest practices. We cannot separate our worship from the proper treatment we give others, especially the poor. If we do these things, the first reading warns us, we must know that God, who has sworn by the pride of Jacob, "will never forget a thing" we have done. In other words, we will be held to full account on Judgement Day. And the gospel describes Judgement Day using the story of the steward who was guilty of dilapidating his master's property. Once caught, we are told the steward tried to pull more tricks out of his hat. He went to the debtors of his master to try to further defraud his master.

Beloved sisters and brothers in Christ, we are all stewards. We do not own anything. Even the very life we live is only given to us to take care of. We are mere custodians of earthly goods and of our very own lives. We are not the masters, they belong to God, and He will hold us accountable. If we do not manage what is not our own well, who then will give us what is our own (eternal life – since man was made to use his freewill to choose it)? Is it not this same bias that we judge some fit or unfit to handle certain responsibilities? Jesus is telling us in today's gospel that we are 'shrewd' if we use the goods of this world to help others and thus ensure our eternal salvation.

Sacrament of Baptism: Parents must be registered with the Parish Office and must have regular attendance at Sunday Mass for at least six months and are required to attend a Preparation Class before the Baptism can be scheduled. To register for the Preparation Class, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Rite of Christian Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA—15 years or older) and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC—7 to 14 yrs. of age), begins in August and ends during the Easter Vigil. These classes are for members who wish to enter in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending RCIA/RCIC, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
