

The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant

REFLECTION

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In calling all of us out of sin, God wants us to be like Him in love and in forgiveness. Our readings for this 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Church Year A, focus on one of the two most important godly virtues of love and forgiveness. They focus on forgiveness, except for the Gospel Acclamation in which Christ's commands to us: "love one another as I have loved you".

The two virtues – love and forgiveness – are inseparable, in my opinion. Genuine love is made possible by forgiveness and forgiveness is impossible without love. It is God's pure love that makes forgiveness of sins possible.

Forgiveness is, therefore, not something we earn or can expect to earn. It is not something we merit or deserve. It is not like a wage to which we are entitled after working a certain number of hours on the job. God's love is a product of His infinite mercy, compassion, and forgiveness of our sins. He did not send His Only Begotten Son to die on the cross for our sins because we earned it. As the Psalmist says, God is "kind and merciful, slow to anger and rich in compassion".

Today's readings are an invitation to all of us to examine our consciences and answer a few tough questions. How do we treat those fellow brothers and sisters whom we consider to be in our debt? Do we show them mercy and compassion? Or are we like the servant in today's gospel passage, who is quick to plead with the master (God) for forgiveness of his own debt; but shows no pity to his fellow servant who is indebted to him?

The clear message from today's readings is that we cannot pray to God for forgiveness of our sins while refusing to forgive one another. The story in our gospel passage (Mt 18:21-35) goes further. It warns that even the forgiveness we may have received shall be taken away from us and we shall turn over to the torture of Hell if we fail to forgive others their trespasses. In more practical terms, we should not expect forgiveness of our sins if we are unwilling to forgive our spouse for erring against us. God will not forgive us if we are unwilling to forgive our parents, our children, our siblings, our co-workers, our friends.

The Gospel message reinforces the counsel from the Book of Sirach. Our first reading (Sir 27:30-28:7) sounds the alarm bells on those of us who spend our lives tightly hugging "hateful things. God invites us anew today to set enmity aside, to stop hanging onto "wrath and anger" and advises against seeking vengeance: "The vengeful will suffer the Lord's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail".

In answer to Peter's question, Jesus instructs us to forgive our brothers and sisters not just seven times; but seventy-seven times. Just in case you are trying to add up how many times your brother or sister has wronged you... let me quickly add that Jesus is not inviting us to keep a count of the number of times we have been wronged. Christ is not setting a limit to the number of times we should forgive one another. Christ is not saying should your brother or sister wrong you a 78th time, you should then say "bingo"! This time around I no longer have an obligation to forgive you. Quite the contrary.

In biblical numerology, the number seventy-seven really means countless or a limitless number of times. In other words, our duty as Christians to forgive should know no bounds, no limits. The very nature of covenant we have with "the Most High", as we hear in our first reading, is to "overlook faults". Saint Paul adds to it in our second reading (Rom 14:7-9) by reminding us that our lives do not belong to us: "None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself," he writes in his Letter to the Romans. "We are the Lord's," he adds "whether we live or die".

Let us pray that God should strengthen our faith to love one another as Christ has loved us and to forgive our brothers and sisters from our hearts as recommended by today's gospel - not only seven times, but seventy-seven or countless number of times. Only then can we pray and expect God to hear our own prayers for forgiveness of our sins. May we never lose sight of the fact that it is only when we forgive others from our heart that we can hope that we will not, like the wicked servant in the gospel, be cast into the hands of the torturers (in Hell) when our days in this world are over.
