

REFLECTION

"You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped; ... All the day I am an object of laughter; everyone mocks me."

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I find the above words from the Prophet Jeremiah quite troublesome. What does the prophet mean that the Lord "duped" him? Does the Lord really deceive people? Is the Lord unkind and manipulative even with His own servants? These words seem to suggest that at one point in the prophet's life he lamented his option for this ministry. It is said that Jeremiah began his prophetic mission as a young tender boy. To make things worse, he seemed to have had speech problem, hence he tried to object his vocation as we read in Jeremiah 1:6: "Ah, Lord GOD!" I said, "I do not know how to speak. I am too young!""

I know a priest (my contemporary in the Major Seminary) who left the priesthood seven years after his priestly ordination. He says that he was attracted to the priesthood while he was still in grade three. His desire was to enjoy the good things he believed the priest in his village was enjoying. In his village, the priest was the only person who had a car; he saw the number of eggs Christians brought to the priest every Sunday. After seven years as a priest, he has come to the realization that the life of the priest is not what he thought it was from a distance. After leaving the priesthood, he claims that he was lured into the priesthood by his childish concepts of the priesthood.

Is this the case with Jeremiah? Did he grow up to discover that the prophetic ministry is not as enjoyable as he thought it was with his childish dreams? I do not think that Jeremiah was outrightly regretting his option for the prophetic ministry. He was not contemplating abandoning God, but highlighting the difference that invariably arises between those who allow themselves to be guided by God, on the one hand, and those around them, on the other hand, who choose to ignore God and live their lives according to their personal whims and caprices. The conscience makes those who live in God restless when they commit sin. When they commit sin, they are so restless, as if, in the words of Jeremiah, there was a fire burning in their hearts.

In like manner, Saint Paul in the second reading warns Christians not to model themselves on the world around them: "Do not conform yourselves to this age ..." It is easy for us to be influenced by what everybody else thinks, to accept something because everybody else does.

The question to ask ourselves today is: Does a restlessness arise in me when I offend God, a restlessness that does not let me have my peace until I get reconciled with God? This is what proves that I am a God-fearing person. This is what we are all called to become. A vocation to Christianity is a vocation to resemble Jeremiah. It is a vocation to see ourselves as different from the world around us that sinks, without qualms of conscience, into pleasure and selfishness. The Christian must resist this lifestyle.

Order of Christian Initiation: The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults begins in August and ends in April. These classes are for members who wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion, and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending OCIA, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Upon request and Communally as scheduled.
