REFLECTION

Our readings for this Sunday ring alarm bells about the dangers we face in this world, inviting us to place our trust in God. The first reading, from the Book of Wisdom, reminds us to seek God's counsel and the guidance of the Holy Spirit if we are to save our souls from the corruptions that come from the desires of our bodies. We are reassured by the Psalmist that God remains our refuge in all ages. Writing from prison, Saint Paul identifies himself as "a prisoner for Christ Jesus", advising us to do good voluntarily and to seek freedom from the slavery of sin and the corruption of this world even if it means imprisonment on account of the gospel. Jesus Christ, in our gospel passage for today, calls us to reject even our fathers and mothers, our children, brothers and sisters, our wives and our husbands, and even our possessions, if they are an obstacle to the mission Christ has assigned every one of us as a disciple: taking up our cross to follow Christ.

The three readings make some reference to the importance of making and following a plan. In our Christian life, we cannot start out well after our Baptism and First Holy Communion only to not complete our journey as Christians. We cannot be like the man who started but could not finish building that ambitious project because they did not plan appropriately.

The readings warn us against arrogance. We cannot be like the king who fails to negotiate peace only to march his army into battle against an army that is stronger than his own army. It is better, the parable tells us, for us to negotiate peace with our brothers and sisters, if we have wronged them, instead of waiting until their anger and desire for revenge overwhelms and destroys us.

In our difficult journey as Christians, our plan for a successful journey must consist of seeking "wisdom in heart". We must be guided by the prayer asking God to let His "face shine upon [us] your servant; and teach [us] me your laws". For our plans, as Christians, to lead us, indeed, to Our Father in Heaven – not halfway there – we are to be guided by God's own counsel. We are to rely on the Paraclete or the Holy Spirit whom God sent to us at Pentecost. Even if we have strayed away from God for "a thousand years", we are not to be afraid. Those "thousand years" of rejecting God are for Him "like yesterday" and He has let us know elsewhere in His Word that there will be more rejoicing in Heaven at one lost sheep being found.

Our plan to lead good Christian lives must be molded considering the lessons we must learn from the imprisonment, persecution and martyrdom of Saint Paul, the Apostles, and other disciples. We are not to be forced, but to voluntarily accept persecution. We are to draw strength, even if we spend our old age in prison, without the assistance Saint Paul was giving up in our second reading, we are to take comfort in the certainty that God is our refuge, not only in ages past, but in all ages. He is God, our refuge, our strength, our God in whom we trust, yesterday, today, tomorrow, and forever. Amen.
