

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 7, 2024

REFLECTION

On that day, all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Divine Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary of Divine Mercy #699)

This message, spoken by Jesus to Saint Faustina in 1931, has now come true. What was spoken in the solitude of a cloistered convent in Płock, Poland, now is celebrated by the Universal Church throughout the whole world!

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Easter — the last day of the Easter Octave — the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This feast is based upon the private revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina. In extending this Feast to the entire Church, Pope John Paul II reemphasized the resurrection context of Easter, citing St. Faustina's diary: "Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Fount of My Mercy."

The readings for this Sunday show us our need for God's Mercy, which is offered to us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the forgiveness of our sins, and through each celebration of the Sacraments (all instituted to sanctify us), when we receive them in trusting Faith.

The first reading from Acts of the Apostles gives us a picture of how the first Christian community grew every day because of the acts of mercy -- sharing, sacrificial agápe love -- practiced by the early Christians. In the first section of the Responsorial Psalm (Ps 118), we repeat three times, "His mercy endures forever!" In the second reading, St. Peter glorifies God, the Father of Jesus Christ, for showing us His mercy by granting His Son, Jesus Resurrection from the dead and a glorious Ascension into Heaven, thus giving us the assurance of our own resurrection. Today's Gospel vividly reminds us of how Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a sacrament of Divine Mercy. The risen Lord gave his Apostles the power to forgive sins with the words, "Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain, they are retained" (Jn 20:19-23). Through the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Church celebrates God's mercy throughout the year.

The Merciful Savior invites all of us to celebrate and practice mercy in our Christian lives. We can heed this invitation by carrying out the corporal works of mercy (feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, ransom the captive, and bury the dead) or the spiritual works of mercy (instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, admonish

sinners, bear wrongs patiently, forgive offenses willingly, comfort the afflicted, and pray for the living and the dead), as a starting point. May God grant us the loving heart we need to show mercy to others in our daily lives. Jesus, I trust in You.

May Saint Bernadette Soubirous, pray for us.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Monday, April 8, 2024 - Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. This feast celebrates the moment when Mary said 'yes' to God's call to be the mother of His Son. The Solemnity of the Annunciation is celebrated every year on March 25, but this year since it occurred during Holy Week, its observance was transferred to the Monday after Divine Mercy Sunday.

REQUESTING A MASS INTENTION

Holy Mass is the memorial of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. The celebration of the Eucharist transcends time and space as it makes sacramentally present the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. The one and only sacrifice of Christ is the central event of human history that brings creation to its fulfillment in God. When Holy Mass is celebrated Christ's redemption becomes reality for each individual person.

It is an ancient Christian tradition for the faithful to give an offering to apply a Mass for their intention. In doing that, they also contribute to the good of the Parish and they support her works and ministers. Canon Law regulates this matter very strictly to avoid even any appearance of trafficking or trading. For example, Canon Law states that "nobody is permitted to accept more offerings for Masses to be applied by himself than he can satisfy within a year."

We are happy to receive your personal intention request for a particular time and date. If you would like to request it, please stop by the parish office at your convenience. Please note, we can only receive one offering per Mass. Of course you are welcome, indeed you are encouraged, to come to Mass on that day your intention is to be taken up. Also, note that a generous donation, is welcome, but it is not the price you pay for a Mass. Also, we would like you to know that even if you cannot make a donation, we will be happy to offer Mass for the intention you request.

Dear parishioners of St. Bernadette,

We are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent (Belarus).

The exposition will take place on Friday, April 12th after the 9 AM Mass.

Sisterhood of St. Elisabeth was founded in 1996. Our missionary began in National mental hospital located not far from the Convent. Sisters take care of mentally challenged children and adults. Life of the child with diagnoses such as Down syndrome, birth traumas or congenital physical defects may be quite short and it is painful to see them suffering. Also the adult patients need constant support owing to the fact that their illnesses make it impossible for them to adapt socially.

In the recent years a shelter and house of Labor for former drug and alcohol addicted people was organized 20 miles away from the Convent. A lot of homeless, struggling and lost people get a chance for new start in life to find the God.

In order to help these people some workshops were organized on the premises of the Convent where vulnerable people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God working together with nuns and sisters and making icons (including hand painted), crosses, crucifixes, wood carvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, rosaries and vestments. All these goods made with love and prayer bring blessings to their owners.

We are happy and thanking God for the opportunity to introduce and offer them to you.
