

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time year B. The readings are about leprosy and God's compassion. In the first reading from the Book of Leviticus we hear how lepers were treated. It was up to the priest to declared that a person has contracted leprosy and to order that that person be separated from his/her family and community because the person now was considered ritually unclean. They were considered a public risk and had to be kept separate. They were considered cursed by God because of their sins and so it was right for people to shun them. Israel was convinced that the community should be made up only of people perfect physically and naturally. This treatment of lepers was in direct contrast to the call made by Saint Paul to the Christians at Corinth in the second reading. Paul urges them not to do anything offensive to anyone but to do everything for the glory of God. In the Gospel passage, Jesus breaks down all the religious and social barriers and reaches out with a loving and healing hand to touch a leper and cure him of the leprosy. This physical contact with a leper was unthinkable since according to ancient Hebrew belief, such a contact rendered a person unclean. By choosing to touch and to heal the man with leprosy, Jesus showed God's compassion for the sick and the outcast.

Dear friends in Christ, in today's Gospel, Jesus teaches us about how to be better disciples of His. He teaches us to grow in more confident trust of God—that God loves and cares for us as His children. This should translate in the way we treat and relate with others, especially the "rejected". We are encouraged not to be afraid to bring our leprosy to Jesus.

Mark Your Calendar Ash Wednesday February 14th, 2024: We are barely three days away from Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Additionally, all Catholics over the age of fourteen are expected to abstain from meat on this day. Pope Saint Pope Saint John Paul II once said: "Lent is a season of intense prayer, fasting, and concern for those in need. It offers all Christians an opportunity to prepare for Easter by serious discernment about their lives, with particular attention to the word of God which enlightens the daily journey of all who believe." This year, Ash Wednesday coincides with Valentine's Day. Lol. The practical implications of this coincidence for those of us Catholic Christians who are accustomed to having some chocolate, roses and perhaps steak for lunch or dinner on Valentine's Day, is that they will have to sacrifice all these goodies this year. In the season of Lent, we are invited to embrace the call to penance, prayer, and almsgiving. Through self-discipline and reflection, may we draw closer to the transformative love of Christ, preparing our hearts for the joy of Easter.

Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday in the parish Church: 9 AM and 6 PM. Ashes will be administered at both Masses.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.): This is the process of becoming Catholic. It is not so much a program as a process. Through the OCIA, men and

women discern God's call to enter the Catholic Church and are helped along in this process by many Catholics of their parish.
