

The Temptation of Jesus in the Desert

#### REFLECTION

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. Mark 1:12–13

Today's Gospel from Mark presents us with a short version of the Temptation of Jesus in the desert. Matthew and Luke give many more details, such as Jesus' three-fold temptation from Satan. But Mark simply states the fact that Jesus was driven into the desert for forty days and was tempted.

What's interesting to note is that it was "The Spirit" Who drove Jesus into the desert. Jesus did not go there against His will; He went there freely in accord with the will of the Father and by the direction of the Holy Spirit. Why would the Spirit drive Jesus into the desert for this time of fasting, prayer, and temptation?

First of all, this time of temptation took place immediately after Jesus was baptized by John. And though Jesus Himself did not spiritually need that baptism, these two series of events teach us much. The truth is that when we choose to follow Christ and live out our baptism, we receive a new strength to fight evil. The grace is there. As a new creation in Christ, you have all the grace you need to conquer the evil one, sin and temptation. Jesus, therefore, set for us an example in order to teach us this truth. He was baptized and then was driven into the desert to face the evil one so as to tell us that we also can conquer him and his evil lies.

As Jesus was in the desert enduring these temptations, "the angels ministered to him." The same is true with us. Our Lord does not leave us alone in the midst of our daily temptations. Rather, He always sends us His angels to minister to us and to help us defeat this vile enemy.

What is your greatest temptation in life? Perhaps you struggle with a habit of sin that you fail at time and time again. Perhaps it's a temptation of the flesh, or a struggle with anger, self-righteousness, dishonesty, or something else. Whatever your temptation may be, know that you have all you need to overcome it on account of the grace given to you by your Baptism, strengthened by your Confirmation and regularly fed by your participation in the Most Holy Eucharist.

Reflect, today, upon whatever your temptations may be. See the Person of Christ facing those temptations with you and in you. Know that His strength is given to you if you but trust Him with unwavering confidence.

Some Lenten Reminders and Devotions: The season of Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (February 14) until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (March 28). "Alleluia" is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil.

During the season of Lent, the Church urges all the faithful to reflect a spirit of prayer, penance (conversion), and charity.

**Stations of the Cross:** Stations of the Cross during Lent will occur on Fridays at 6 PM with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. This will happen at the Parish Church.

Daily Mass: Attending at least one extra Mass during the week is one of the best penances we can do for Lent. It strengthens us with the grace of the Blessed Sacrament so that we can draw closer to Christ. Moreover, it also can change our whole perspective on daily life, reminding us in a dramatic way that our faith isn't just for Sundays, but for every day and every moment of the week.

Sacrament of Reconciliation with Private Confession: There will be a communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation with an opportunity for private confession on Wednesday of Holy Week, March 27, in the Parish Church from 4 PM to 5:45 PM.

## St. Joseph Conference, Society of St. Vincent de Paul 2023 Annual Report to the Parishes

The St. Joseph conference has completed another successful year of providing assistance to those in need in our community. During this calendar year, \$28,500 was expended by the conference for assistance to residents within the boundaries of the parishes of St. Joseph and St Bernadette. With the exception of a gift of \$3,000 from the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store in Wheeling, all of these funds were donated by those in our parishes.

This was a typical year for our Conference. The largest expenditure was for utilities, followed by rental payments and various miscellaneous items. We prevented electric, water, and sewer terminations, forestalled evictions, repaired appliances, and assisted with food security and a few other miscellaneous expenses.

Our Conference operating expenses are minimal. Our "rent" consists of a monthly cell phone bill; other expenses include State Business Licensing fee, and liability insurance premium, totaling just over \$500 for the year.

Over the 22-year life of our Conference, through the generosity of our supporters, we have collected and distributed nearly \$550,000 to those in need. YOUR generosity has permitted us to continue to assist our fellow citizens.

We always welcome new members to our conference. If you feel called to assist in this ministry, please call our conference phone at (304) 671 0569, and leave your name and number. One of our members will contact you and invite you to our next monthly meeting. Many hands make light work, and some of our members have work and family constraints that limit what they can do.
