

REFLECTION

'God is good'. All the time. And all the time. God is good!'

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, Welcome!

This is the final Sunday before Holy Week (also known as Passion Week), which begins next Sunday with Palm Sunday leading up to Easter Sunday. Today we focus our attention on the nearness and coming of the hour of Jesus' glorification.

Our readings this weekend invite us to meditate on God's unconditional love for us despite our sinful nature. We are no different from our fathers in faith about whom the Prophet Jeremiah writes in our first reading. They (our fathers, but also all of us) broke the covenant God made with them in leading them by the hand out of bondage and slavery in Egypt. Thanks to God's infinite love and despite our sins, He has not forsaken his shattered people, but will soon make "a new and more intimate covenant" with them (us), says Jeremiah in our first reading. This covenant has been realized in the suffering and death of His Only Begotten Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ – a moment He refers to as "the hour of glory'. "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified," Christ says, willingly accepting to undergo his Passion.

In our second reading last Sunday, Saint Paul reminded us that it is not through our own efforts that we are saved, but through the love and mercy of God. In today's second reading in his Letter to the Hebrews, he explains that God seeks us out and offers us salvation, because the "prayers and supplications" offered on our behalf "with loud cries and tears" by Christ have been heard by God. Through His obedience and suffering Christ became the source of eternal life for all who obey him".

In the very first message of His public ministry, Christ tells us how we can be saved: "Repent and believe in the gospel", He tells us. "For God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that everyone believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life". For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn. 3:15-16).

In these remaining days of Lent, let us join Psalmist in our Responsorial Psalm in pleading to our "good and compassionate God" to have mercy on us; to "thoroughly wash" us from our guilt; to cleanse us of our sins; to "create a clean heart" in us; to cast us not out from his presence; and not to take the Holy Spirit from us.

Today's gospel passage provides the following reminder to all servants of Christ: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be". To be true servants of Christ, we must turn to God,

confess our sins, truly do penance for them, and dedicate our lives to loving God and loving neighbor, as ourselves. Only by doing so can we hope that God will restore to us "the joy of [his] salvation". In today's gospel passage, Christ reiterates what our prize will be: "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself". However, this is not a "free for all" because He does not mince his words when he tells us: "For God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that everyone believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). Therefore, let us work and pray to be counted among those Christ draws to himself on the last day.
