REFLECTION

Dear Friends in Christ,

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Happy Easter! Today we celebrate the most sacred day for all Christians - Easter Sunday. St. Gregory of Nazianzus, the Theologian, in his paschal sermon, declares: "Pascha - this is the feast of feasts and the festival of festivals, which outshines all other solemnities as much as the sun outshines the stars." 'This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Ps. 118).

Permit me to begin this short reflection with this quotation from Pope Benedict XVI's 2011 Easter homily. "Easter morning brings us news that is ancient yet ever new: Christ is risen! The echo of this event, which issued forth from Jerusalem twenty centuries ago, continues to resound in the Church, deep in whose heart lives the vibrant faith of Mary, Mother of Jesus, the faith of Mary Magdalene and the other women who first discovered the empty tomb, and the faith of Peter and the other Apostles."

Right down to our own time, our faith as Christians is based on that same news. The Resurrection of Christ is truly the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles because it validates who Jesus claimed to be, namely the Son of God and Messiah. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (I Cor 15:14). "Jesus is Lord, He is risen" (Rom 10:9), was the central theme of the preaching of the Apostles.

The resurrection of Jesus is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me will live even though he dies..." (Jn 11:25-26). If Jesus Christ is not resurrected, then we have no hope that we will be, either. In fact, apart from Christ's resurrection, we have no Savior, no salvation, and no hope of eternal life. As Paul said, our faith would be "useless," the gospel would be altogether powerless, and our sins would remain unforgiven (1 Corinthians 15:14-19). In resurrecting Jesus from the grave, God reminds us of His absolute sovereignty opened to us the path to eternal and blessed life.

that life is worth living. May it also give us stren-

gth to fight against temptations and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Will be held Wednesday evening from 5:20—5:50 PM, Saturday 4—4:45 PM, and Sunday 8:15—8:45 AM. Confession is also available by appointment at anytime. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment.

Order of Christian Initiation: The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults begins in August and ends in April. These classes are for members who wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. If you need to receive Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion, and/or Confirmation, and are interested in attending OCIA, please call the Parish Office at 304-754-7830.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples planning to marry at St. Bernadette Catholic Church should be practicing Catholics, participating in Sunday Eucharist regularly. Also they must participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. Call the Parish Office for information. At least six months notice is required. No date for a wedding will be set over the phone.

Holy Communion to the Sick and Homebound: When a Parishioner is confined to home or hospital because of illness or advanced age, call the Parish Office. We will be happy to make arrangements to bring Holy Communion.
